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RECURRING QUESTION... STRANGELY.

HOW ARE YOU SO CHEAP? AND WHY? THIS IS A REAL QUESTION WE HAVE, AND IT'S A GOOD QUESTION. LET'S ANSWER IT.

When we first realized GUP Tech was cool enough to become a real project, it was time for us to define our mission.

Some gear manufacturers want to be in every music store, in every country, to become rich and famous. For us, it was way simpler than that: We wanted to be accessible (and sell a pedal to Gary Holt once in a while, just for the thrill of it).

What does it mean, really? It means that we just want musicians to be able to afford expanding their musical creativity, without compromising their rent, nothing more. As long as we can pay the mortgage and food for the chickens. When we did the Montreal Knob-Session expo last year, other pedal builders were "angry" at our prices, because they couldn't compete with us, and felt threatened. We could have raised our prices, and our reputation amongst pedal builders would have been better. Unfortunately, we don't build pedals for pedal builders, we do it for guitarist (and bassists).

In the past couple of years, we have been asked to sell batches to bigger stores. Each time, we had to decline, because we are three people, working from our home and we don't have "time" to do that. Plus, we don't like mass production. Building 100 (insert whatever pedal model we have) is not fun. In fact, it kills the vibe, and we promised ourselves that would stop when it's not fun anymore.

Take our new Wah the Nut! To be profitable for us, the selling price should have been around \$300 CAD. We know it's too expensive, and it goes against our brand, so we kept it lower. GUP Tech is too beautiful to be stained by greediness.

Inflation has been bad enough, prices are high. We will keep ours as low as possible, as long as our suppliers don't dramatically raise theirs. How can musicians be creative if they cannot afford their tools? If you want to throw money at us, buy pedals, we have a great selection!

PEDALBOARDS?

PEDALBOARDS ARE A DELICATE SUBJECT, BUT WE CANNOT REALLY SKIP IT, CAN WE?

We have made a whole blog post in May 2022 regarding pedalboards, and even posted some that our customers and fans have sent us. Some worship them, some don't care, some even hate them. Some want the cleaneast one without a visible cable, other really just want to have the pedals fixed and plugged without any second thought.

Since the beginning, we have been using Ric's Pedalboards, handmade in New Brunswick (Canada) and we love them. We have 3 and this is the "Made for testing" that Guillaume had made last year.

This time, it's not a new pedal, we had the prototype released a long time ago, Lab 37, in May 2021. This is a phaser, a pedal we have in very limited quantity, only three models.

We'll make a limited quantity available, only 16, and you won't have the option to choose the colour, it's our call! The custom colour option won't be accessible with it, if someone does it, we'll have to refund!
