FIREWORKS SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Consumer Fireworks are for sale to persons 18+ years of age.

ALWAYS BRACE OR BURY YOUR FIREWORKS

ALWAYS BRACE OR BURY AERIAL FIREWORKS--unless the instructions on the label indicate otherwise. For example, do NOT ignite Fireworks Cakes on the ground without securing them. They can tip over and shoot sideways, causing serious injury to persons nearby.

- BURY aerial Fireworks to half their height in a pail filled with earth or sand; or
- BRACE aerial Fireworks by placing bricks, sandbag or other heavy objects on both sides of them.



BE A GOOD NEIGHBOUR! Notify your neighbours when you are going to shoot Fireworks. Some of them may have pets to protect. Others may be alarmed if they do not expect the noise. ALWAYS clean up your Fireworks debris, particularly any that lands on someone's property other than your own.



KEEP fireworks in a cool, dry, ventilated place, out of the reach of children.



PEOPLE UNDER 18 YEARS OLD who use fireworks must be supervised by an adult.



CHOOSE a wide, clear site away from all obstacles. Refer to the safety instructions on the fireworks label for minimum distances from spectators.



DO NOT FIRE IN WINDY CONDITIONS.



READ all instructions on the fireworks.

PLAN the order of firing before you begin.



NEVER try to light a firework or hold a lit firework in your hand unless the manufacturer's instructions indicate that they are designed to be hand-held.



LIGHT CAREFULLY: Always light the fuse at its tip.



KEEP WATER NEARBY Dispose of used fireworks (including debris) in a pail of water.



WAIT at least 30 minutes before approaching a firework that did not go off. NEVER try to relight a firework that did not go off. NEVER try to fix a firework that is defective.



ALWAYS WEAR SAFETY GLASSES: Safety glasses or goggles are recommended for individuals lighting fireworks and those individuals in close proximity to the fireworks.
