

BLUEBERRIES



Blueberries are, to a degree, self-fruitful. However, we recommend planting at least two different varieties to optimize fruit production (larger berries & larger yields). Choose two to three varieties with identical or adjacent bloom times for best pollination

Bluejay	Northern highbush. Upright. 5'-7'	Medium	Early	June - July	Orange to yellow.	Best for freezing, pies, and canning
Cabernet Splash	Northern Highbush. Upright. 3'-4'	Medium	Mid	July	Fiery red	In spring, dark carbernet foliage that turns red in fall. Sweet, delicious berries.
Chandler	Northern highbush. Slightly spreading. 5'-7'	Largest	Mid to late	Mid July through August	Wine and orange	World's largest blueberry. Best fresh or as dessert
Duke	Northern highbush. Upright. 4'-6'	Large	Early	Early to Mid July	Orange to burnt yellow	Use for baking and eating fresh. Full, rich flavor
Jelly Bean™ Bushel and Berry	Dwarf lowbush. Ball-shaped habit. 12"-18"	Large	Mid	Mid July to Early August	Dark red hues in summer to fall	Sweet, tastes like natural preserves. Great for containers
Jersey	Northern highbush. Tall upright. 6'-8'	Medium	Late	Late July to Mid August.	Orange to flame	Great for baking, freezing and jam
Patriot	Northern highbush. Open spreading. 3'-5'	Large	Early	Early to Mid July	Fiery orange - red	Excellent garden variety. Highly flavored.
Perpetua™ Bushel and Berry	Upright. Vase shaped. 5'	Small	Mid-Late and very late	Mid July to Mid August and September	Dark green foliage turns deep red	Great for patio containers and small hedges
Sweetheart	Highbush. Vigorous 5'-6'	Large	Mid to late	Mid July and August	Red	Fabulously sweet, flavored berries. Fresh eating or as desserts.
Top Hat	Dwarf lowbush. Globe habit. 1'-2'	Small	Mid	Mid July	Bright red and orange	Great for low borders and containers. Good for bonsai
Toro	Northern highbush. Upright & stocky. 4'-6'	Large	Mid	Mid July	Bronze, bright red	Outstanding ornamental quality. Great for baking.
