1. The London Silver Vaults

"In this remarkable centre there are some 30 dealers in antique and contemporary silver of every kind from tableware to candlesticks," says John Andrews. 2. John Carlton-Smith

"If ever there was a true gentleman of the antiques world it has to be John," says Mark. 15. Bourne Gallery



21. Andrew Dando

Andrew Dando specialises in pottery and porcelain, English, Continental and Chinese export, but Mark's favourite part of his stock is his distinctive Staffordshire pottery, whether it be figures of a man and woman feeding chickens or of a crocus planter in the form of a hedgehog.
