Spearheading a new breed of young designers, Rita Konig likes her interiors to look 'as undecorated as possible'. Her designs are easygoing,

quirky and fun, underpinned with a rigorous understanding of clients' needs. She's the perfect choice for those in search of colour, a casual vibe and expertly pitched vintage pieces.

Background Rita has worked as an interior designer for the past 12 years, including a sixyear stint in New York. Now based in London, she continues to criss-cross the Atlantic for selected projects. Rita twins her design commissions with style journalism: she's European editor for T Magazine at The New York Times, and also writes a column for House & Garden.

Projects Rita is converting a Notting Hill pub into apartments and working on a hotel and members' club in Hollywood. She is also completing a house in New York and a beach house in Antigua for the same client.

NEW ENTRY Robert and Josyane Young are the experts behind Robert Young Antiques in Battersea and also run this sought-after design consultancy.

They take on just two to three projects concurrently, interweaving historical accuracy and respect for architecture with what Robert lightly terms 'the occasional rough accent'.

Background Rivière was founded in 1983, evolving out of demand from the antiques shop's clients. Robert and Josvane trained, respectively, at Sotheby's and the V&A, and navigate between contemporary and traditional spaces. They design, source and commission everything from specialist paint finishes to art. Projects Focusing mainly on private houses, Rivière is currently creating guest rooms in a house in Highgate, and working on a small Georgian town house in Kensington and a hunting lodge in Belgium. Robert and Josyane recently completed a seventeenth-century house in Highgate and a nineteenth-century family house in Notting Hill.
