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Know Your Gemstone

How are gemstones formed?

For any gemstones, color is the determining factor if it is of the best quality which includes the hue position, intensity or the richness of color, and tone. Clarity comes in second which is judged by the visibility of inclusions and the impact on durability. Displaying the gem's inherent beauty to the greatest extent possible or the Cut is the third factor to look upon when buying a gemstone.

"If the gem is beautifully cut, things such as depth percentage or length-to-width ratio matter not one bit. What works, works. The eye, the mind, and the heart are the final arbitrators, not numbers."

The last but not the least is the carat or the weight. The size of a gemstone is measured, not by its dimensions, but by weight. Two gemstones of the same size can vary in weight owing to

different proportions. N
