



"I have an itch."




"Scratch it," says Sal.

So Gus does scratch -- and scratch and scratch and scratch -- with the branch!




"At last!" says Gus. "My itch is gone!

"Good," says Sal. "Shall we go have some lunch?"




So Gus and Sal set off to have lunch.
