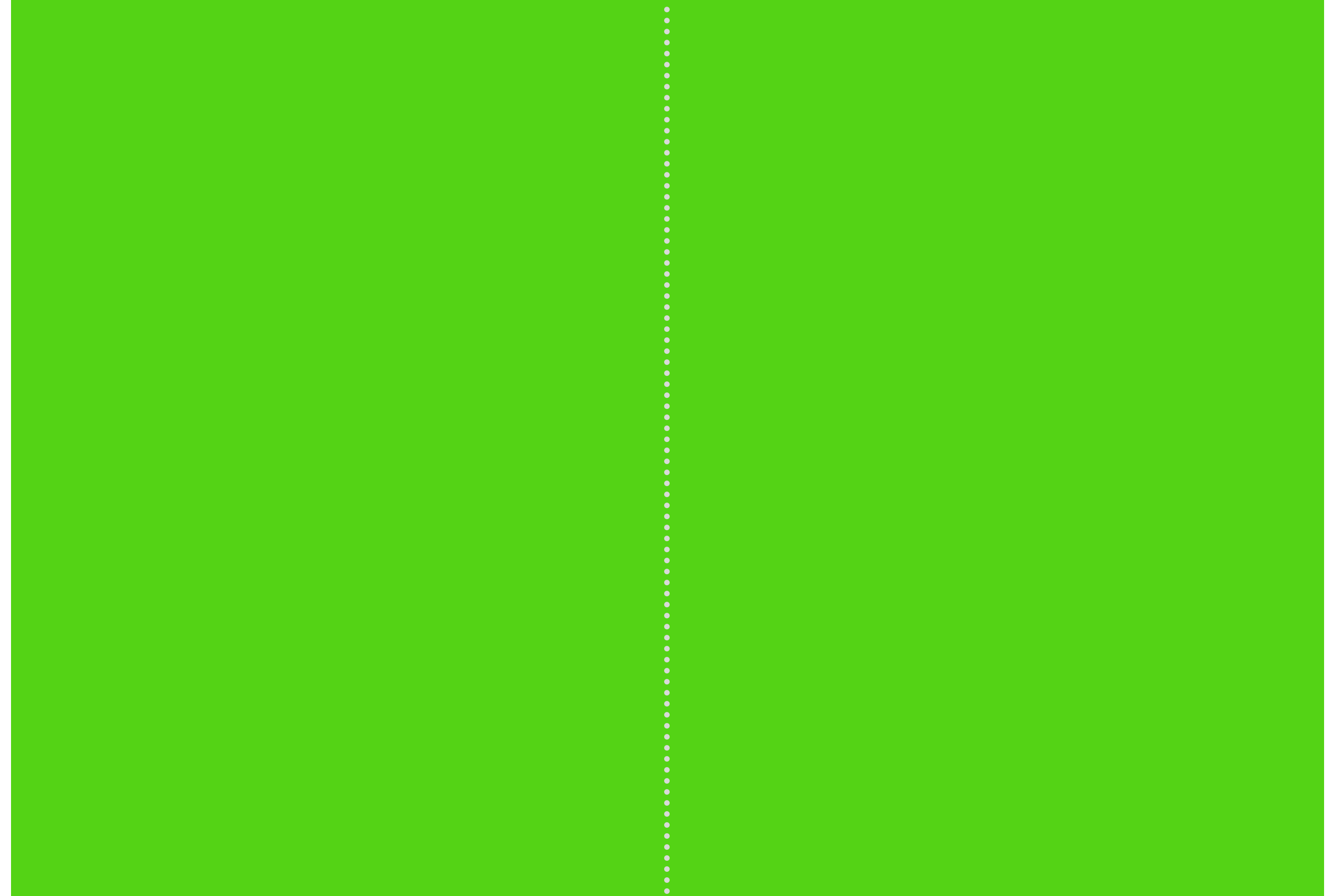


**Fabric Blank**

# Step 1

## Fold in half

Fold with the face of the fabric on the outside. Fold from the widest side.

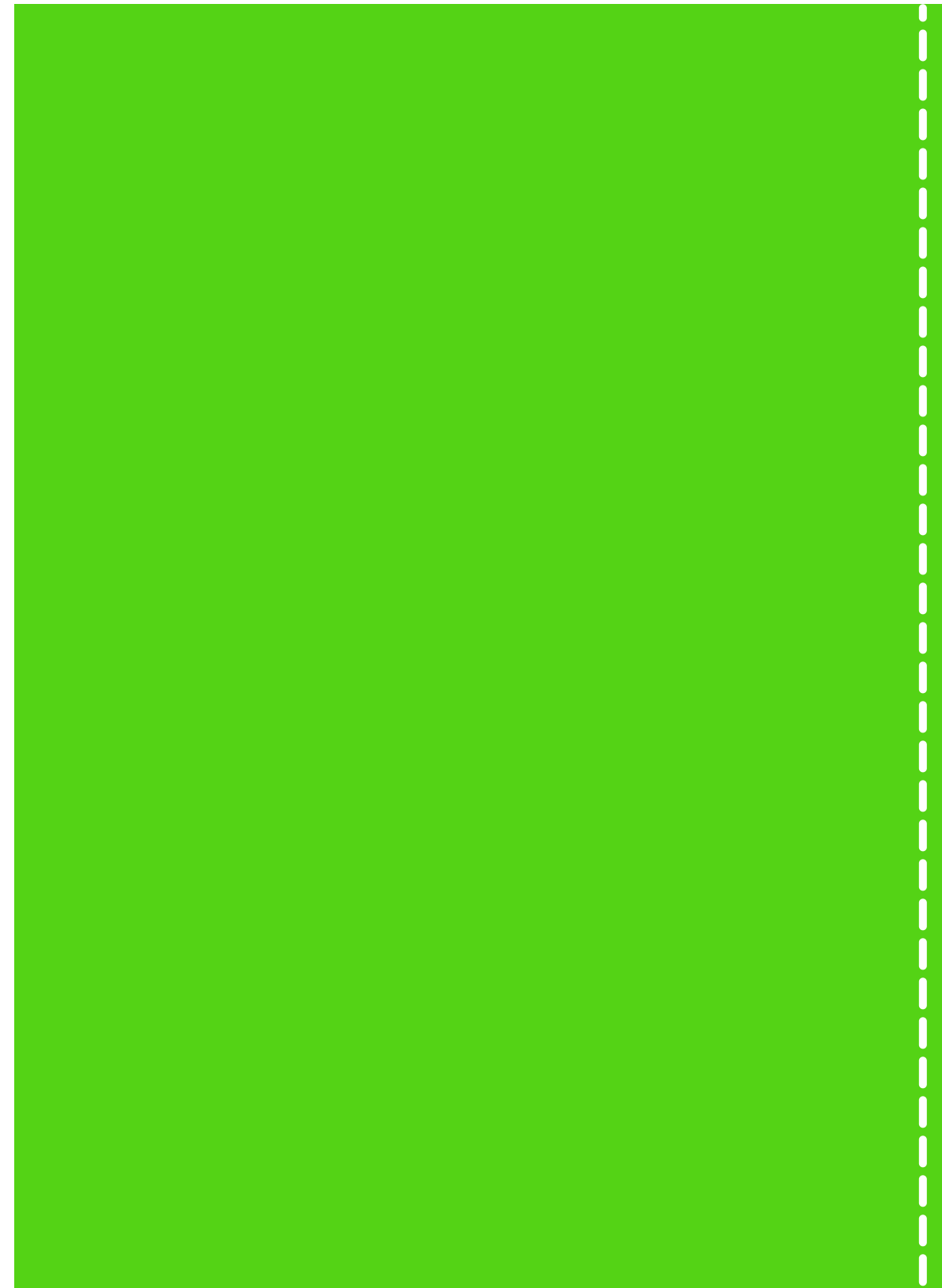

# Step 2

## Run Seam

Use a straight stitch with ~.5" seam allowance. Along the side of the fabric.

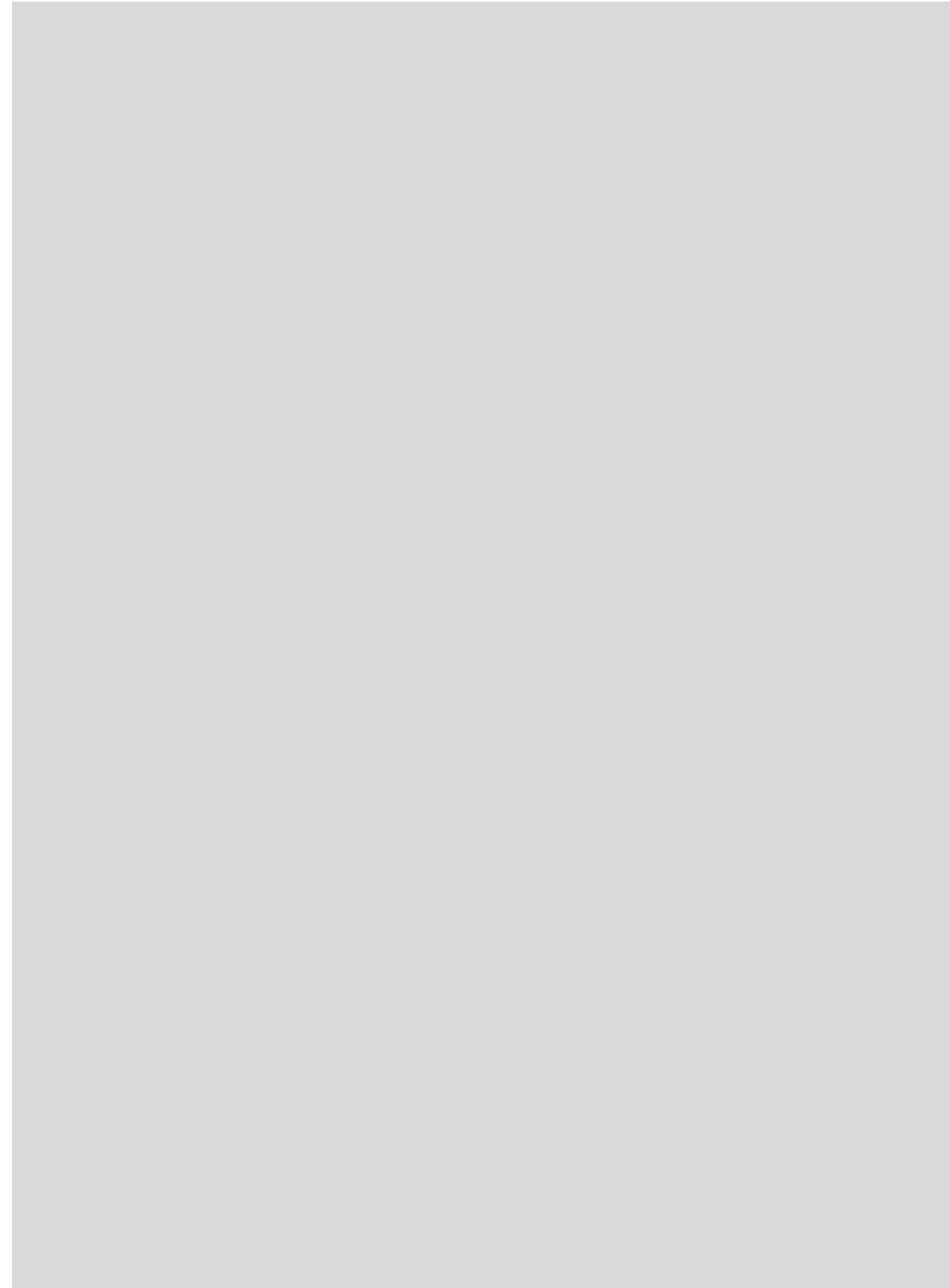

# Step 3

## Turn Inside Out

Turn the project inside out so the faces of the fabric are on the inside facing one another. The seam you just ran will now be folded inside.



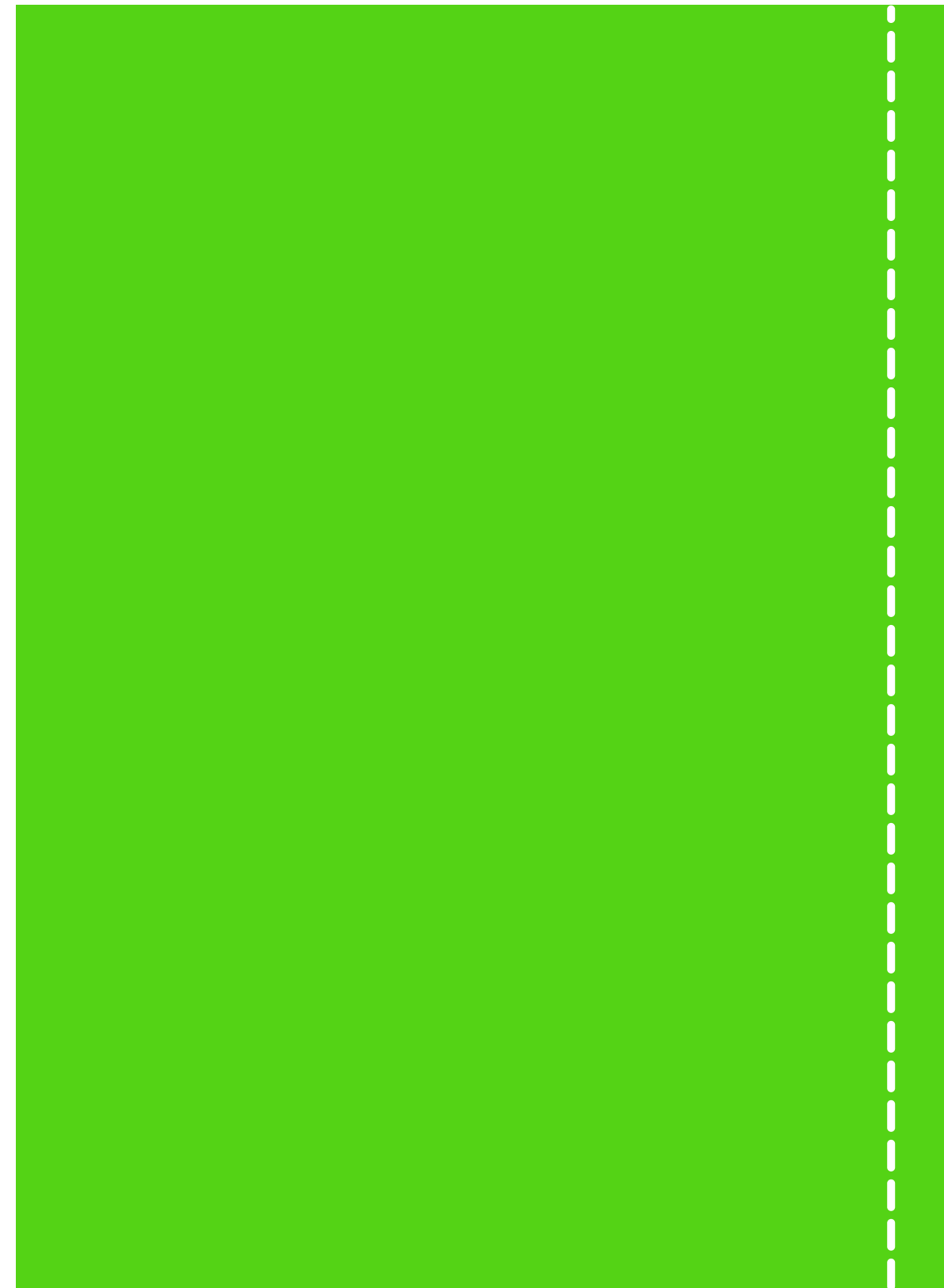

# Step 4

## Run Seam

You will now run a seam over the flap that was made from the seam allowance of seam #1.

You are strengthening the waterproofness by making a double seam.



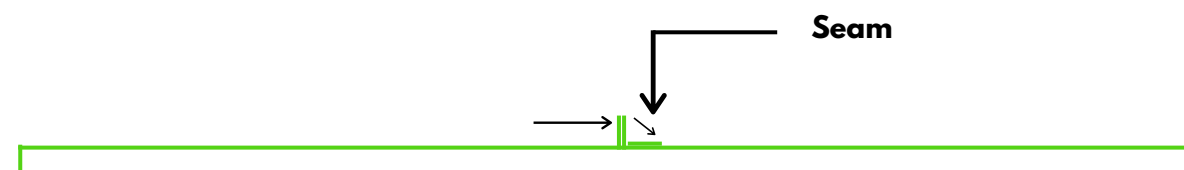
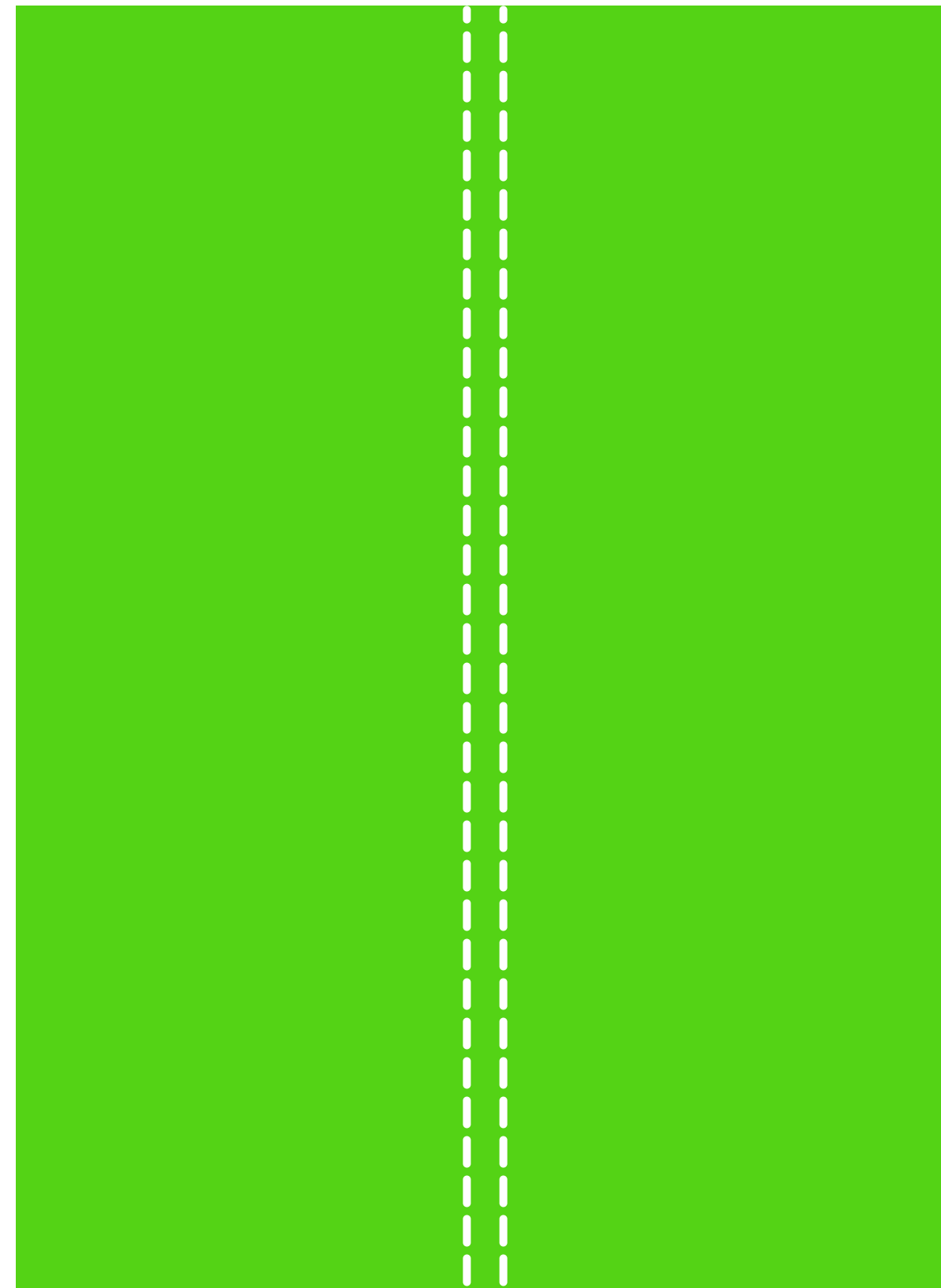

# Step 5

## Stitch Flap

You will now run a seam that stitches down the flap that you've made from the last two seams.

This will cause there to be two parallel stitches on the outside of the bag.

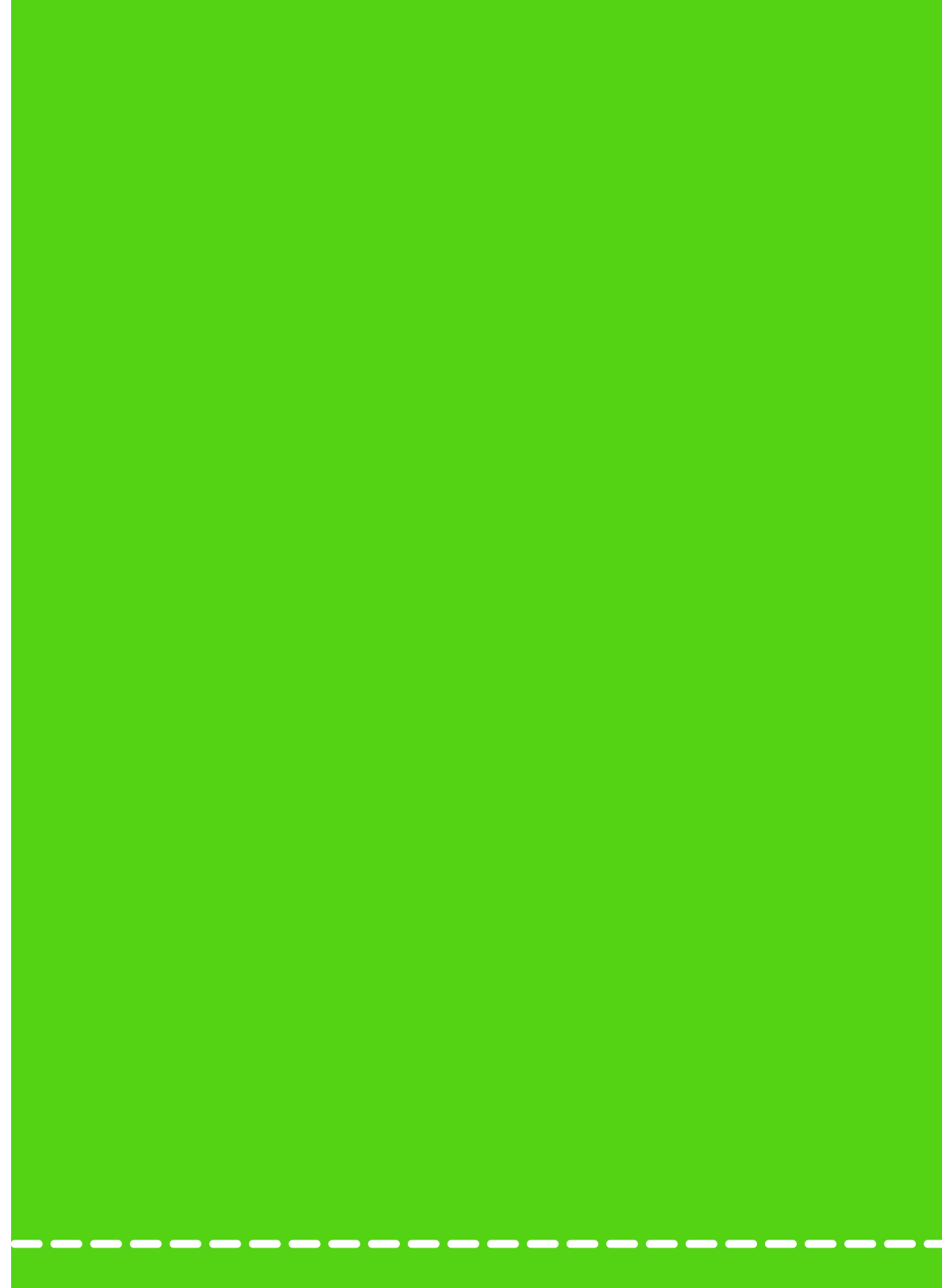

# Step 6

## Run Stitch

You will now run a straight stitch along the bottom of the project. Make sure the face of the fabric is facing out.

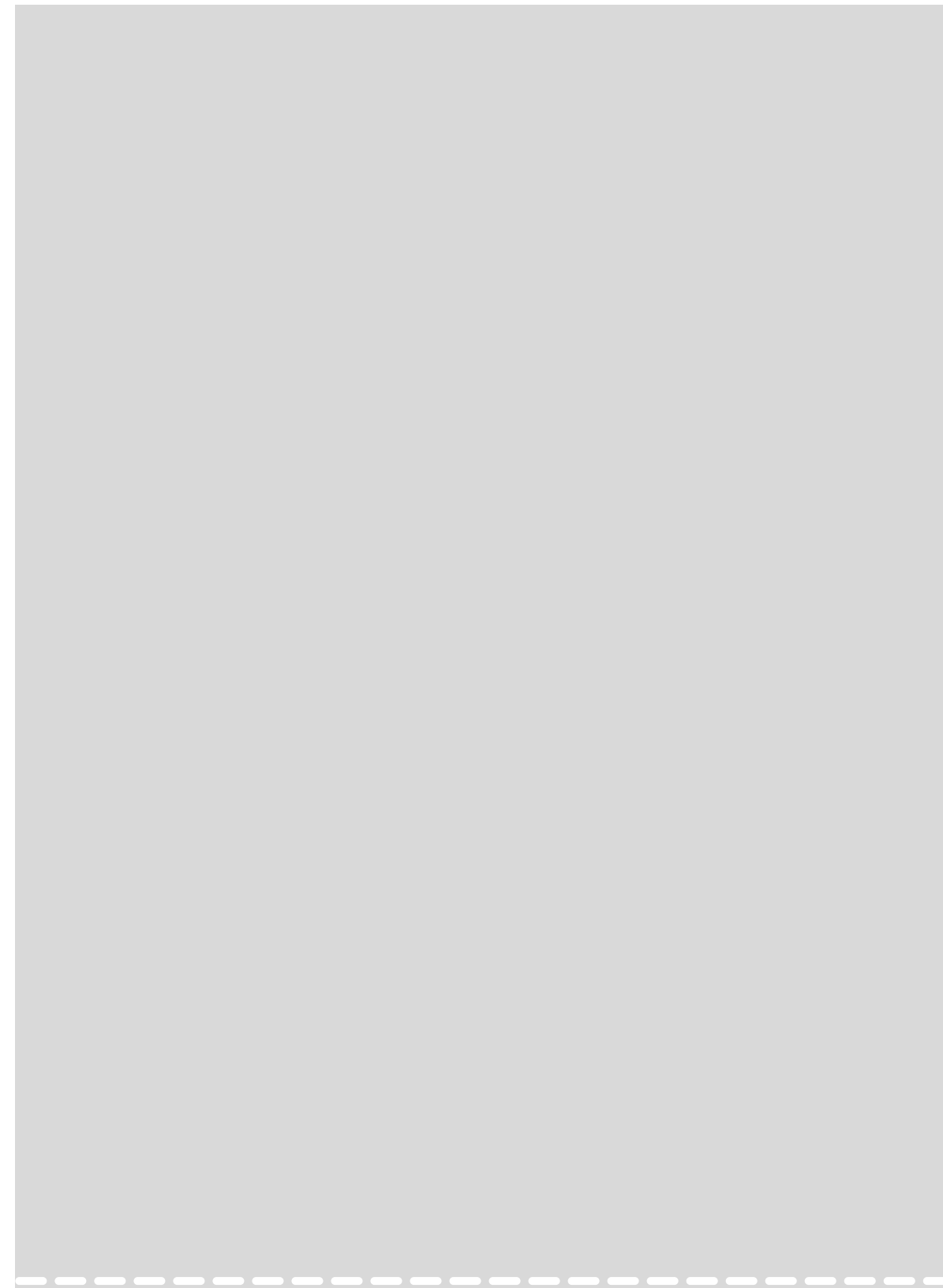

# Step 7

## Turn Inside Out

Turn your project inside out so the back of the fabric is facing out.

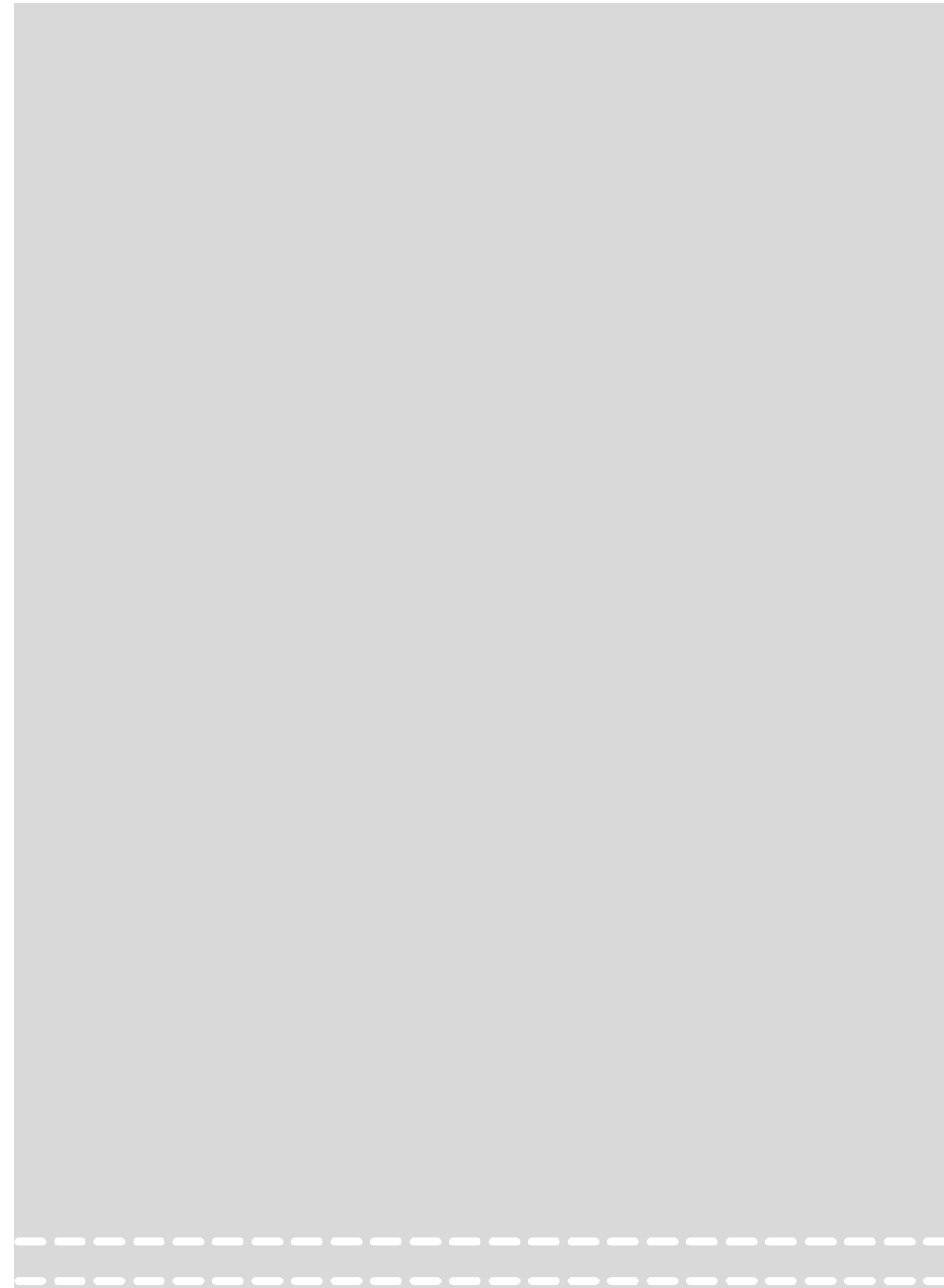


# Step 8

## Run Stitch

You will now run a seam over the flap that was made from the seam allowance of Step #6.

This will be covering the stitch that was made from Step 7.
