

Ring Sizing Guide

If you're not able to stop by your local jeweler to be sized, you can purchase a ring sizer from everthinejewelry.com or use this guide to measure an existing ring.

Step 1: Confirm Scale of Printed Paper



Before you print, make sure that **Page Scaling** is set to **"None"** in your print dialog options.



Measure the bar to the left—it must be **exactly** 1 inch.

Or place a U.S. quarter over the image here—it should fit **exactly** over the image without hanging over any edges or showing any of the image beneath it.



Measuring Tips

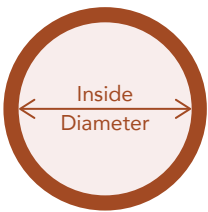
Wider Bands

If you're ordering a ring with a wider band than the one you are measuring, you may want to order a half size larger.

Between two sizes?

If your ring is between two sizes, order the larger size!

Step 2: Measure an Existing Ring



Choose a ring with the desired fit. A plain, narrow band works best since wider bands can fit slightly small.

Place it over the circles below, matching the **inside edge of your ring** to the circle closest in size. This is the inside diameter of your ring!
