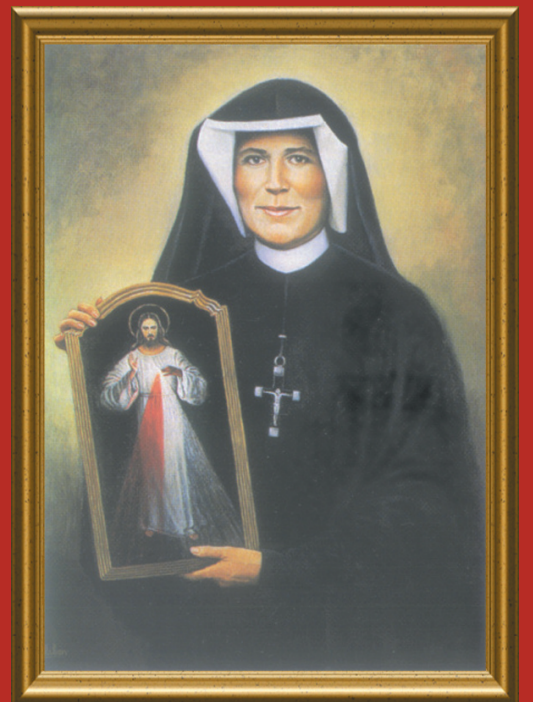

**Your Nine Day Novena to Divine Mercy begins Good Friday**



### Our Lord speaks:

"Speak to the world about My mercy... it is a sign for the end times. After it will come the day of justice (Diary 848)...Souls perish in spite of My bitter passion...I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of Mercy. If they will not adore My Mercy, they will perish for all eternity. Secretary of My mercy, write, tell souls about this great mercy of Mine, because the awful day, the day of My justice, is near" (Diary #965).

### Our Lord speaks:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon these souls that approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sin and punishment. On that day all the divine flood gates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity." (Diary 699).

### Our Lord speaks:

"The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter (Diary 699)...I desire that priests proclaim this great mercy of Mine towards souls of sinners. Let the sinner not be afraid to approach Me, the flames of mercy are burning Me-clamoring to be spent; I want to pour them out upon these souls" (Diary 50).

### Conditions of plenary indulgence for feast of mercy

Sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the Pope and his intentions, on the second Sunday after Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from sin, even venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament recite the Our Father or creed, or adding a prayer to the merciful Jesus (e.g. Jesus, I trust in You).

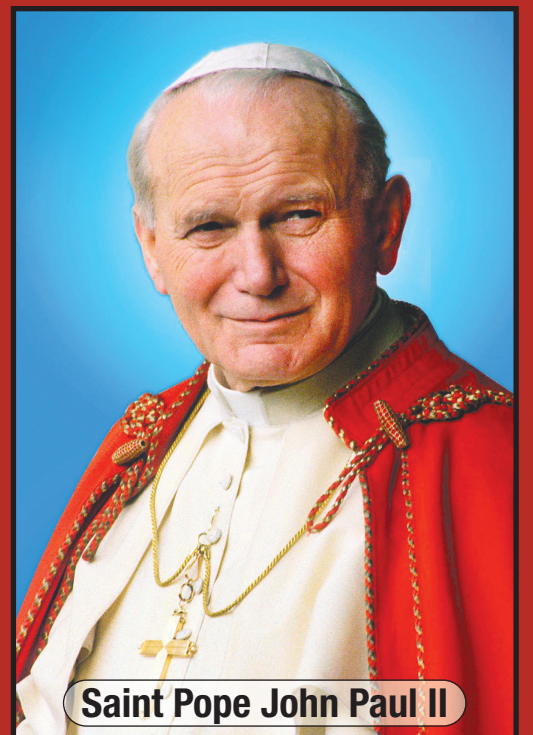
### Due to our priest shortage, or grave condition (e.g., war, prison and sickness)

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; (Feast of Mercy) but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act.
