## ABOUT THE PATTERN

The "Heaven Cardigan" draws inspiration from the celestial skies and the enchantment of Greek mythology. To capture this essence, it is knitted using two strands of mohair, creating a voluminous effect reminiscent of clouds and an ethereal feel.

This cardigan is worked seamlessly from the top down, commencing with the back panel, featuring an elegant combination of beads and cables. Upon reaching the desired length and completing the necessary increases, the back is placed on hold, awaiting connection with the fronts that originate from the same back panel, incorporating the same cable pattern. Once the desired length for the fronts is achieved, they are joined with the back, and the knitting continues as one piece.

The pattern continues with the bead motif, concluding the body section with another stunning bead design and lacework. The sleeves are seamlessly integrated using short rows and feature a beaded ribbing to finish.

SIZES

Recommended ease: positive ease $5 \mathrm{~cm} / 2.5$ ". The picture shows a size 1 in $80 \mathrm{~cm} / 32$ " bust.

A) Cross Back (shoulder to shoulder):
$35(38,41,44,46)(48,50,51,56) \mathrm{cm}$.
$14(15,16.5,17.5,18.5)(19,20,20.5,22.5)$ ".
B) Bust circumference total:
$85(93,103,113,123)(133,143,153,163) \mathrm{cm}$.
$34(37,41,45,49)(53,57,61,65)$ ".
C) Armhole depth:
$20(22,22,24,24)(25,27,27,29) \mathrm{cm}$.
8 (8.5, 8.5, 9.25, 9.25) (10, 10.75, 10.75, 11.5)".
D) Underarm to hem body length:
$31(32,33,34,35)(36,37,38,39) \mathrm{cm}$
$12.5(12.75,13.25,13.5,14)(14.5,14.75,15.25,15.5)$ ".

## E) Upper arm

$41(46,46,50,50)(54,56,56,60) \mathrm{cm}$.
16.5 (18.5, 18.5, 20, 20) (21.5, 22.5, 22.5, 24)"
suggested needles and cables


- Main needles: $5 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{US}$ 8, or size needed to obtain gauge.
- Ribbing needles: $4.5 \mathrm{~mm} /$ US 7 .
- Cable lengths: Yoke: $60 \mathrm{~cm} / 24$ " to $80 \mathrm{~cm} / 32$ ", Hem: $80 \mathrm{~cm} / 32^{\prime \prime}$, Sleeves and cuffs: preferred needles for small circumference knitting (or used Magic Loop or DPNs)."


## NOTIONS



- Crochet hook 0.75 mm (no.10)
- Crochet hook 4.5 mm (7).
- Row counter (recommended).
- Stitch marker.
- Tapestry needle.
- Waste yarn or stitch holders.

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## 16 stitches $\times 22$ rows $=10 \mathrm{~cm} / 4$ "

Measured over stockinette stitch knitted flat after blocking, with main needles.
F) Total Sleeve Length (without cuff):
$48(49,50,51,52)(53,54,55,56) \mathrm{cm}$.
$19.25(19.5,20,20.5,20.75)(21.25,21.5,22,22.5) "$.

- To measure the armhole depth, place the tape measure on the highest part of the shoulder (where the shoulder bone protrudes) and measure down to the underarm.
- Determine the bust circumference by placing the tape measure right under both underarms.
- I recommend choosing your size based on the bust circumference.
- If the selected size has a deeper armhole depth than desired, consider adjusting it by following instructions for a size with closer measurements to your preferences.
- Modifying the armhole depth instructions will also require adjusting neckline shaping and sleeves accordingly.
