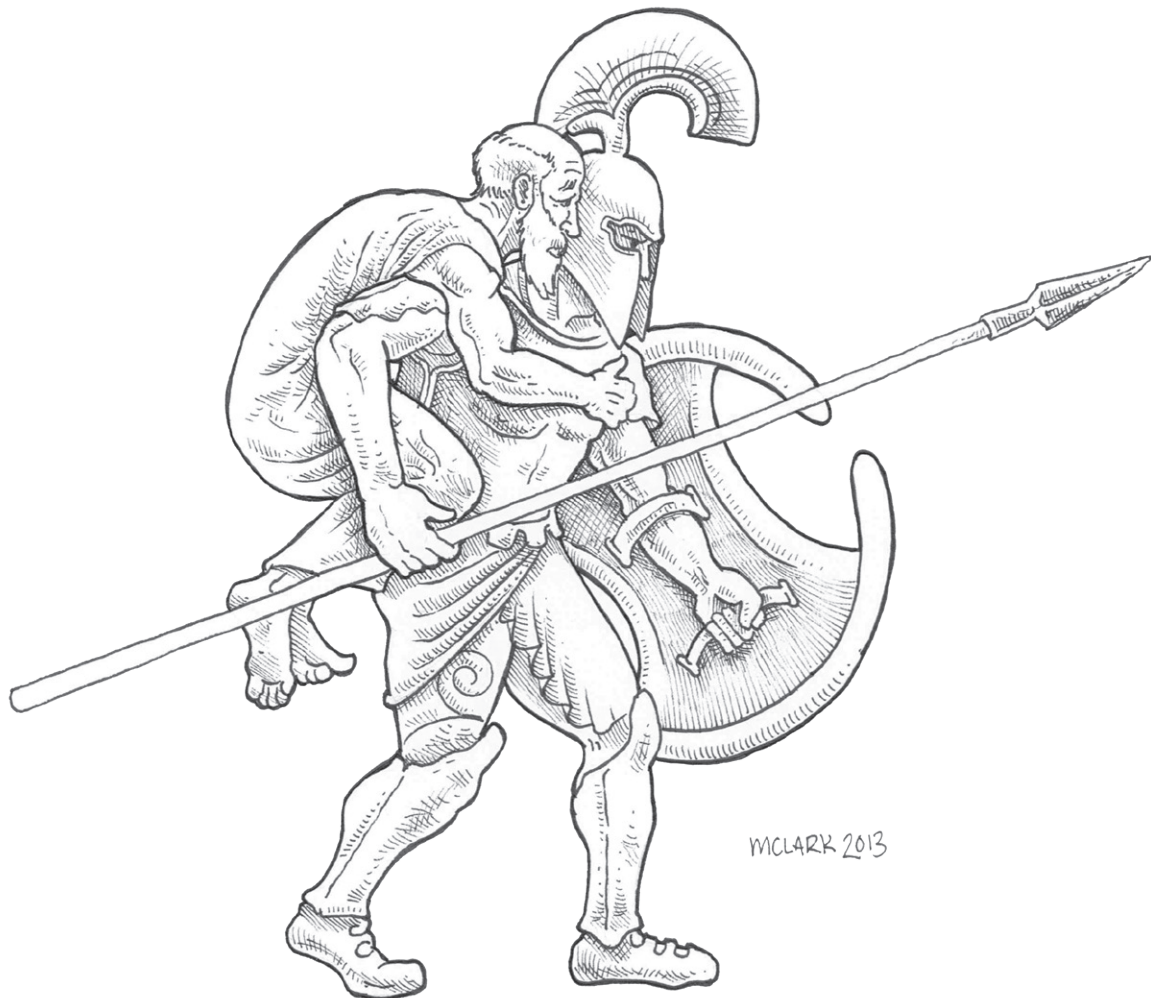

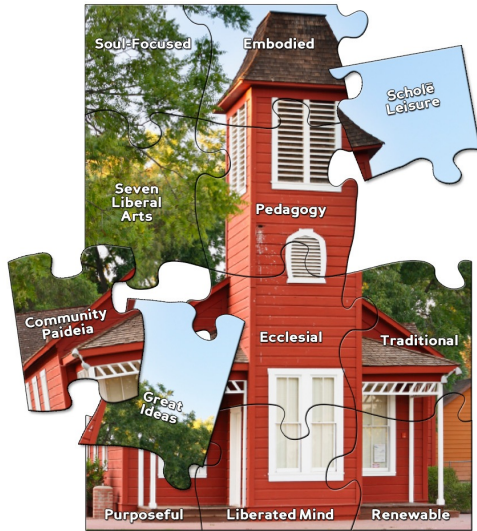
The proper love and fear of God and man.

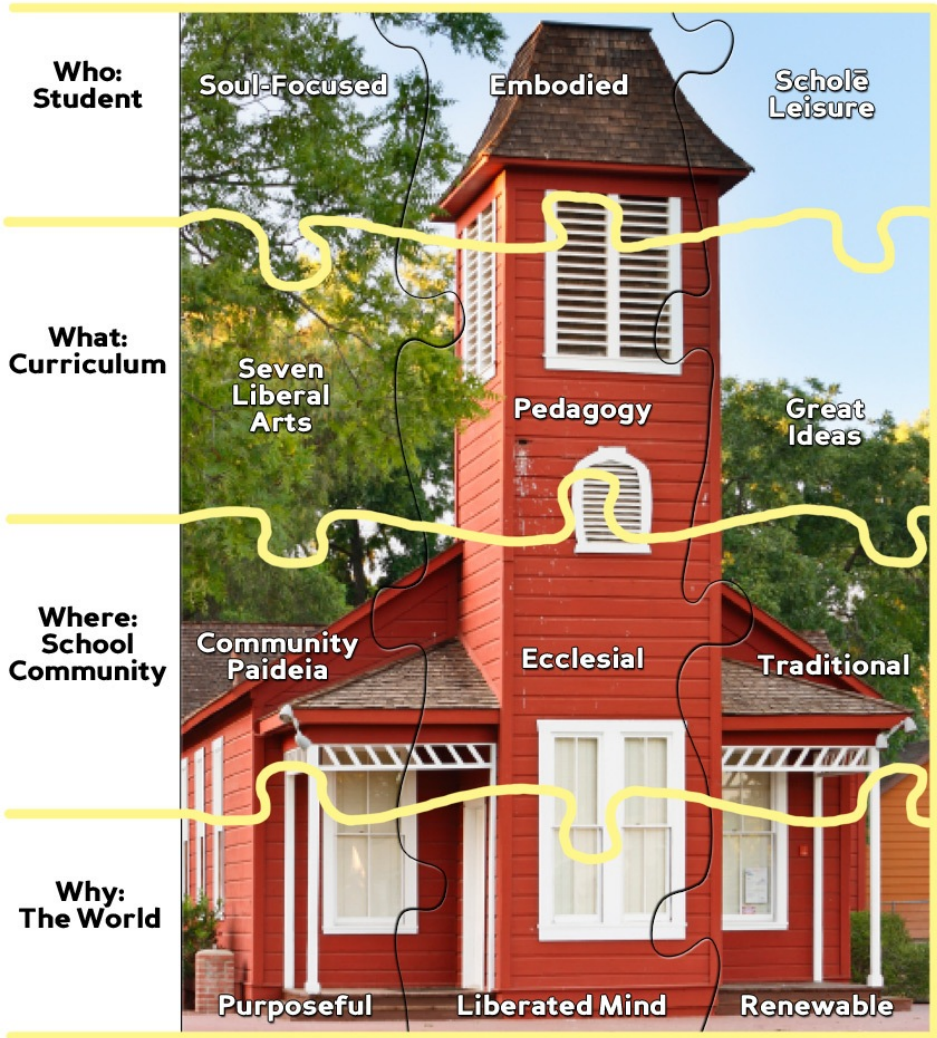

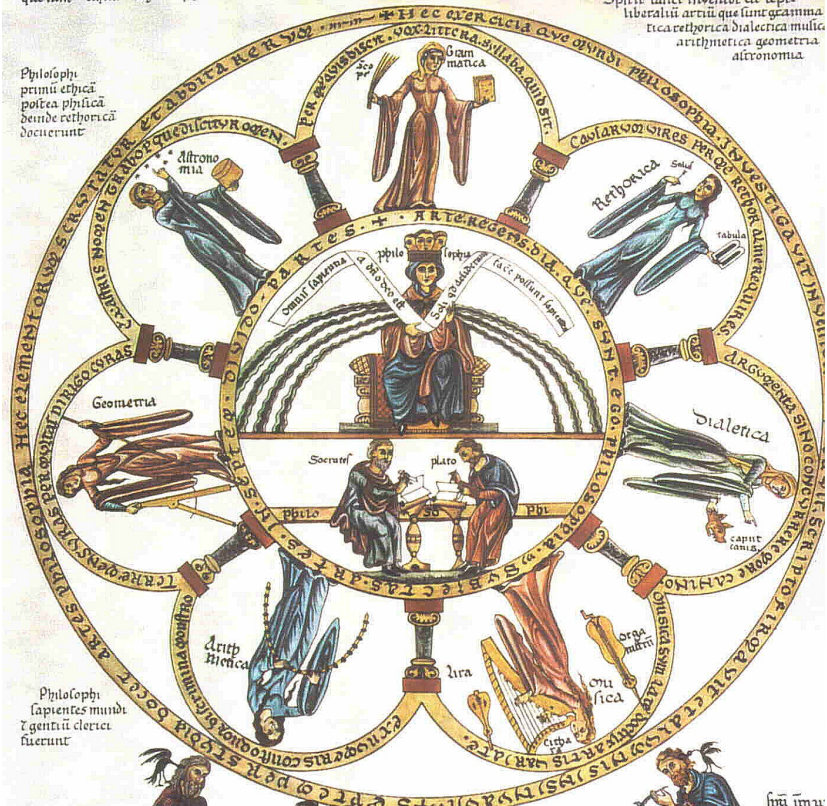




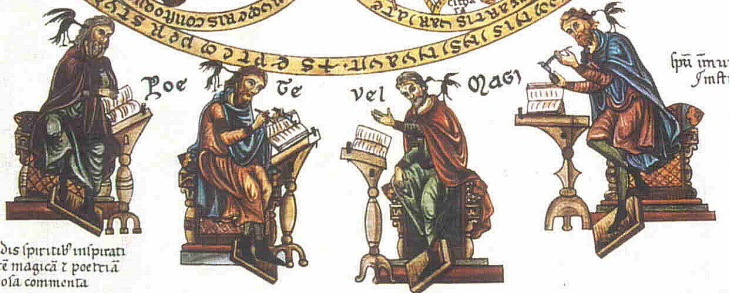

Tower of the Seven Liberal Arts (1508)

The youth, having mastered his letters, is escorted by Wisdom to the temple of knowledge.

Congruitas (**Grammar**) at the door; Donatus and Priscian (1st and 2nd floors); **Logic** with Aristotle; **Rhetoric** and **Poetry** with Tully; **Arithmetic** with Boethius (3rd floor); **Music** with Pythagoras; **Geometry** with Euclid; **Astronomy** with Ptolemy. Then **Philosophy** (physics, morals) with Seneca. Lastly, **Theology** (or metaphysics) with Peter Lombard.

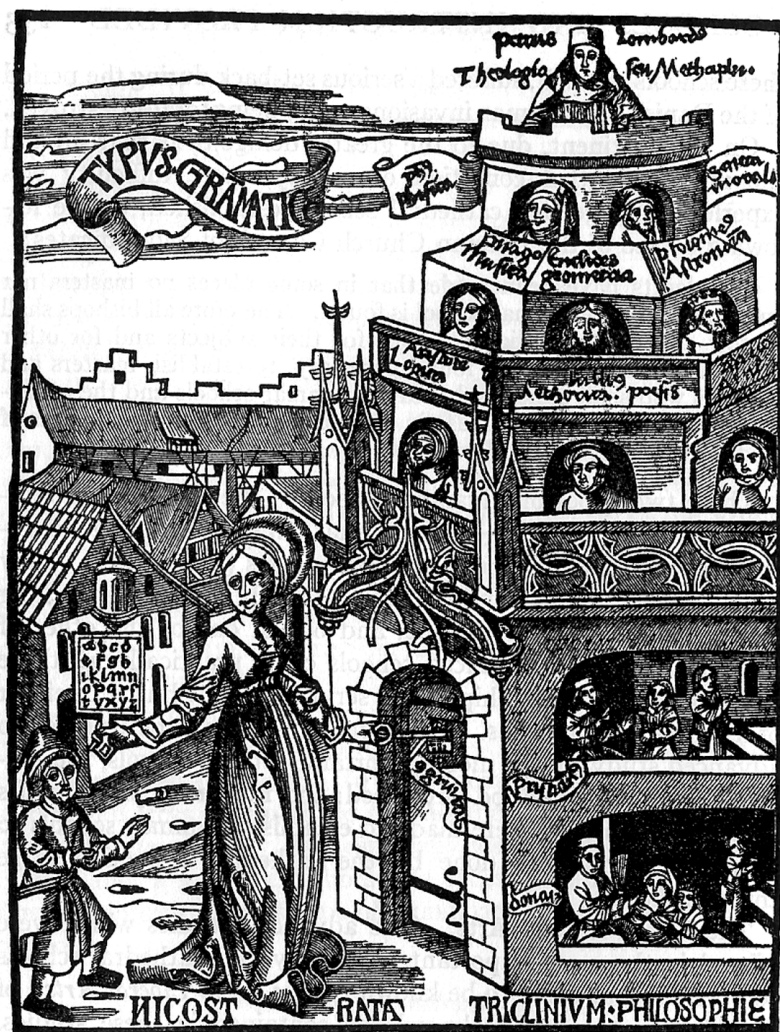


FIG. 44. THE MEDIEVAL SYSTEM OF EDUCATION SUMMARIZED
