Add an expanded TE note: Because figures of speech can overlap, answers will vary. The answer choices for the following lines have also been expanded: #3 - Parenthesis, parallelism, asyndeton, apposition #8 - Anaphora, oxymoron, paradox #10 - Metaphor, personification #19 - Antimetabole, chiasmus, epanalepsis, anaphora, polyptoton

Page 263	In the last paragraph, righthand column, change Kevin to Oliver.	Should be: For example, they will want to be assured that Oliver is a good traveler . . .
Page 355	The text for Aristotle's treatment of the emotions from his <i>Rhetoric</i> was not included in our book.
