You may have noticed a couple odd things in this chart. First, there is no letter *c*! Instead, you will use a $\vdash (k)$ for the hard *c* sound, as in "cat," and a \forall (*s*) for the soft *c* sound, as in "century." There are also some "combination letters," such as \ddagger for the *ch* sound and \parallel for the *sh* sound, so do not expect the cuneiform spelling to exactly mirror our English spelling!
