People often ask me what camera I use. I answer them, "The one on my hip." It's really not about the camera, but rather the time of day, the quality of the light, and the composition. I always want a photograph to say something, to create a mood, to make you feel or think a certain way. Some shots are taken slowly and methodically, others in 'the blink of an eye.' When the camera is always on your hip, you're more likely to get the result you're seeking.
