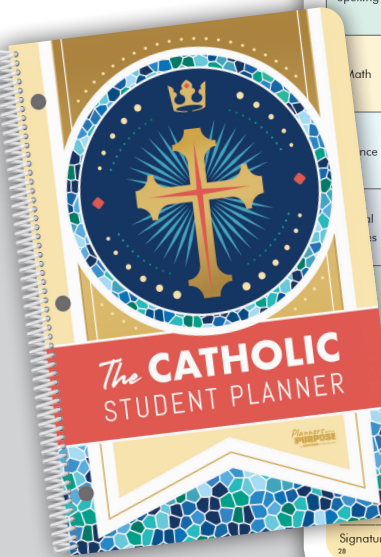
The top of every day includes a Bible verse while the daily content rotates between eight different themes:
