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How do I get started?

First, you will want to gather your supplies. Depending on which format you purchased from us, you will need different supplies. So, take what applies, and skip over the rest.

*** Printing:

- *Print instructions and study guide on white copy paper.
- *Print the booklet templates on 24# colored paper.





*** Assembly:

*Folders: We use colored file folders, which can be found at Wal-Mart, Sam's, Office Depot, Costco, etc. You will need 5 file folder. You may use manila folders if you prefer, but we have found that children respond better with the brightly colored folders. Don't worry about the tabs.... they aren't important. If you prefer, you can purchase the assembled lapbook bases from our website.



*Glue: For booklet assembly, we use glue sticks and sometimes hot glue, depending on the specific booklet. We have found that bottle glue stays wet for too long, so it's not a great choice for lapbooking.



*Other Supplies: Of course, you will need scissors. Many booklets require additional supplies. Some of these include metal brad fasteners, paper clips, ribbon, yarn, staples, hole puncher, etc. You may want to add decorations of your own, including stickers, buttons, coloring pages, cut-out clipart, etc. The most important thing is to use your imagination! Make it your own!!





Ok. I've gathered the supplies. Now how do I use this product?

Inside, you will find several sections. They are as follows:

- 1. **Student Assembly and Completion Instructions:** This section is written directly to the student, in language that he or she can understand. However, depending on the age of the child, there may be some parent/teacher assistance needed. These instructions will tell the student exactly how to assemble the lapbook base and how to cut out and assemble each booklet. Here, they will find a layout of where each booklet should be placed in the lapbook and pictures of a completed lapbook. They will also tell the student exactly what should be written inside each booklet as he or she comes to it during the study.
- 2. **Booklet Templates:** This section includes all of the templates for the booklets within this lapbook.
- 3. **Study Guide:** This section includes most of the information that you need to teach this subject. You may choose to teach directly from the Study Guide, or you may choose to allow your student to read the study guide himself. Either way, you will find all of the information here.


Lapbook Base Assembly:

First, you will need to assemble the "Lapbook Base" for your project. For this lapbook, you will need 5 file folders. Open the file folder, and lay it flat in front of you. Fold both sides of each folder toward the middle. The edges (or tabs) of the folded sides should touch the center original fold line on the folders. See **Figure 1**.

Lapbook Layout:

However, you may have trouble fitting all of them in unless you follow the layout below. Some of the shapes aren't exactly the same on the layout as the booklets themselves.

Cover Page

This page is included as an *optional* cover page for your child(ren) to color, cut out and use as a cover to their lapbook.

Make A Note Of It

Near the end of each lesson, you will find a section called "Make A Note Of It". In this section, you will find journaling topics for each lesson. Record your thoughts and responses to these questions/prompts in this booklet.

*Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer black line edges of all of the booklet pages. Fold inward along the bold line so the title is on the top. Punch holes along the left side of the folded booklet and individual pages. Insert the individual pages inside the outer cover pages beginning with lesson one and ending with lesson ten, including a blank page after each labeled page. Use a ribbon or yarn along the right edge to secure the pages of the booklet.

Vocabulary Booklet

There are many words within this book that will help you better understand and express your faith to others. At the end of each lesson, you will go back to this booklet and record the definition of each word that is listed. Write your definitions under the "tabs" for each word.

*Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer black line edges of all pages of this booklet. Fold inward along the bold line so the title is on the top. Insert the individual flap books inside the outer cover pages. Staple along the right edge to secure the pages of the booklet. Be sure to wait and staple when you have all of the pages together as there will be additional vocabulary pages in later lessons.


Scripture Pocket Booklet

Arming yourself against worldly things is something all Christians have to do. Memorizing God's word and *hiding it in your heart* are very important step to this. Memorize the scriptures and recite them to a parent or friend.


*Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the pocket. Then fold the tabs back along the bold lines so the title of the pocket is on the front. Glue the tabs down to a slightly larger square of colored paper or directly to the lapbook. At the end of each lesson section, in the Student Instructions, you will find scriptures suggested for memorization taken from each lesson. Using the tags provided here, write each suggested scripture onto one of the tags. Cut the verse tags out along the outer black lines. Punch a hole in the top of each tag and secure with a metal brad, ribbon or paper clip. Store the tags in the scripture pocket.

Lesson 1:

- 1. *Booklet Title: Journey To America Booklet
- *Student Instructions: In this booklet, explain why the Chang family is trying to escape from China and what you think life will be like for them in America.
- *Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet. Then fold inward along the bold lines so the title is on the front.
- 2. *Booklet Title: Called To Servanthood Booklet
- *Student Instructions: As we are learning in lesson 2, we are all here on a mission from God. This mission will require certain tools, talents, and gifts for you to be successful. Fill out the provided *Call To Servanthood* form, and take an inventory of your tools. List any doubts you might have, and explain what you think a life of servanthood looks like.
- *Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the pocket and form. Then fold inward along the bold lines so the title is on the front, gluing the tabs to create an envelope. Fold and insert your *Call To Servanthood* form into the envelope for storing.
