


If you are not from Canada, you may find some words spelled differently to the spellings you are familiar with. Canada follows British English spelling for most words.

Lapbook Layout:




Inside of 1st Folder

Cover Page

This page is included as an *optional* cover page for your child(ren) to color, cut out and use as a cover to their lapbook.



Booklet #1

*Booklet Title: - Saskatchewan Map

*Student Instructions: This is a map of Saskatchewan. Look for a map in an atlas or online and see if you can find the names of some of the main towns and cities, rivers, and lakes. Label and/or color this map if you desire.

**Assembly Instructions: Cut out along the outer edges of the cover of the booklet. Then fold the attached flap under along the dotted line. Cut along the solid border around the image of the provincial map. Glue the inside of the cover flap to the back of the left side of the Saskatchewan map, so that the cover page folds over the map. When you open the cover, the map will be visible on the inside. This booklet will attach to your lapbook by gluing the back of the map to the lapbook, as seen on page 7.




Booklet #2

*Booklet Title: - "Saskatchewan"

*Student Instructions: Do you know what 'Saskatchewan' means? It comes from a word that is centuries old. Find out what it means and write the definition on the lines provided.

**Assembly Instructions: Cut along the outside black line edges of the booklet. Fold the three flaps inward along the dotted lines. The back of these flaps will glue directly onto your lapbook, when you are ready to assemble it. Cut out the 'word meaning' sliding paper tab. This paper tab will slide in and out of the pocket you have created above.





*Booklet Title: - Borders








Booklet 1: Saskatchewan Map





