Notes

Blind Hem

Fabricheavy material, 6" x 8"
Needle 70/10 Microtex Sharp
Thread 100 weight silk thread
Foot ..BERNINA Reverse Pattern Foot #1/1C and #5 Blind Hem Foot

Stitch#2 zigzag and #9 blindstitch
Needle Position as needed

Blind Hem

Finish one 6" edge of the fabric by oversewing with a Honeycomb stitch or Overlocker

Fold a 1 1/2" hem to the wrong side of the fabric and press.

Baste, engaging the basting feature on Models B 790 PLUS and B 880 PLUS otherwise elongate stitch t 6mm in length

Fold hem back to the right side over the basting line.

Sew on the extended hem allowance, keeping the folded edge next to the guide on the foot.

Adjust the stitch width or needle position as needed so that the needle barely stitches into the fold.

Mount the sample with the edges folded back as shown.



Notes

Hand Picked Hem

Fabric lightweight batiste or cotton lawn, 6" x 8"
Needle 80/12 Microtex Sharp
Thread 50 weight cotton thread
Presser Foot BERNINA Blind Hem Foot #5
Stitch blindstitch #9
Needle Position as needed

Handpicked Hem

Turn up a 1/2" hem along one of the 6" edges and press.
Turn up the depth of the hem again and press.
Fold the entire hem toward the right side of the garment, so that the garment fold is almost even with the top edge of the hem. A scant 1/16" of hem edge should be visible. This will ensure that both folds are caught by the blind hem stitch.

Place the fabric under the foot just as a traditional blind hem would be placed.

Sew the hem with Blindstitch, making sure that the zigzag catches both folds while the straight stitch falls off the edge and stitches (sewing on no fabric) forming a chain along the upper hem edge. Adjust stitch width if needed.

Press and mount the sample.

Joining Batting

Fabric two pieces batting, 8" x 10"
Needle 90/14 Quilting
Thread Aurifil Cotton 50 wt
Presser Foot BERNINA Edgestitch Foot #10/10C
Stitches Rampart Stitch #13
Needle Position center

Flat Joining Seam

Select the Rampart Stitch # _____

Cut Your batting right sides up barley overlapping in the middle. Use a rotary cutter to make a gentle curve.

Line the #10 center guide with the butted edges of batting. When the needle swings right, it takes a bite out of the right batting, When the needle swings left, it takes a bite out of the left side.



Notes

Rolled and Whipped Edge

Fabric lightweight cotton lawn, 6" x 4"
Needle 80/12 Mocrutex Sharp
Thread 100% cotton 60wt
Presser Foot BERNINA manual Buttonhole Foot #3/3C
Stitch zigzag #2
Needle Position Center

Rolled and Whipped Edge

Clean one 6" lengthwise edge of "whiskers"

Select the Zigzag Stitch
SW = 4mmmm and SL = 0.9mm
Loosen the top tension to 2.25

Notes:

- The left swing of the needle should be in the fabric, while the right swing falls off of the right edge of the fabric.
- As needle swings left, it should roll fabric into a tiny rolled edge.
- The finer the fabric, the finer the needle and thread used.

Trim and mount the sample.

This edge finish is used on a single thickness of fine lightweight fabrics. It is also use as a seam finish or as an edge on ruffles, hems, etc.



Notes

Super Stretch Seam

FabricJersey knit, 4" x 6"
Needle 80/12 Ball Point
ThreadMettler Silk Finish 50wt 100% Cotton
Presser Foot BERNINA Reverse Pattern Foot #1/1C
Stitch stretch
Needle Position center

Super Stretch Seam

Cut fabric in half lengthwise creating two pieces, 2" x 6" each.
Select the Stretch Stitch.

Position the fabric to produce a 5/8" seam down one side.
Stitch the seam; if fabric stretches, lighten the presser foot
pressure (if available).

Clip one seam allowance in the middle and press one part of
the seam open.

Trim and mount the sample.

Note: This stitch is good for an open seam on all knit fabrics;
works well for sportswear.
