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## Disappearing Nine-patch Quilt

What you need:

- Thread
- $141 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Ruler
- 6 or $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " Ruler
- 48 - background squares (solid, low volume, light or dark is fine)
- 60 - multi color, solid contrasting squares
- We used 5" squares for all of the above, but any sized square will work

Assemble 12 nine-patch blocks from the squares above. The quilt we are making is made up of 12 blocks


Here is a nine-patch example.
You will need to make 12 of these for the crib-sized quilt.

The final measurement is $14^{\prime \prime}$


Cut the 14 " nine-patch block in half so that you have 4,7 " units.



Cut the 14 " nine-patch block in half so that you have 4, 7 " units.

Then turn each unit (quadrant) $1 / 4$ turn counter-clockwise to form the new block.


Assemble 12 new blocks, which measure 13 ½" (13" finished).

Your quilt top is complete.
