Disappearing Nine-patch Quilt



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
What you need:

- Thread
- 14 ½" Ruler
- 6 or 6 ½" Ruler
- 48 background squares (solid, low volume, light or dark is fine)
- 60 multi color, solid contrasting squares
- We used 5" squares for all of the above, but any sized square will work

Assemble 12 nine-patch blocks from the squares above.

The quilt we are making is made up of 12 blocks







Here is a nine-patch example.

You will need to make 12 of these for the crib-sized quilt.

The final measurement is 14"








Cut the 14" nine-patch block in half so that you have 4, 7" units.

Then turn each unit (quadrant) ¼ turn counter-clockwise to form the new block.





Assemble 12 new blocks, which measure 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (13" finished).

Your quilt top is complete.
