This month's kit comes with a yard of 1/4" elastic

For more durability, you may choose to use ½"
 - ¾" elastic

Fabric Selections:

Book Worm: Dark Blue

Bookish: Passport

Bookish: Readers Passport

Bookish: Mark My Words

Bookshelf in Ivory

Bookwork: Parchment text

You will also need thread to match fabric and a 14" zipper

Recommended that you use a <u>small (size 3 or smaller) nylon zipper</u>



Additional Supplies

MACHINE FEET

1/4" Patchwork Foot: #37, #37D, #57, #57D, #97 or #97D for BERNINA Machines

Zipper Foot: #4, or #4D for BERNINA Machines

INTERFACING


Fusible woven or SF-101 for strengthening the cotton fabric







Favorite Book

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Cutting

This month's fat quarter project will yield many book caddies. You can use one fat quarter to make a bag or mix and match your fabrics to make it more patchwork-like

***NOTE: Be mindful of fabric direction. The width is the skinnier part.

For Larger Books:

- Outer fabric
 - $3-5" \times 10"$ Rectangle
- Inner fabric
 - $1-5" \times 10"$ rectangle
- Scrap
 - $2-3" \times 1 \frac{1}{2}"$ for zipper tabs
- Interfacing
 - $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ " × 10"
 - $2-5" \times 10"$
 - $2 3" \times 1 \frac{1}{2}"$
- Elastic
 - 9 ½" length (depends on the book)
- Zipper
 - 9" length of a 14" small nylon zipper



Cutting

This month's fat quarter project will yield many book caddies. You can use one fat quarter to make a bag or mix and match your fabrics to make it more patchwork-like

***NOTE: Be mindful of fabric direction. The width is the skinnier part.

For Smaller Books:

- Outer fabric
 - $3 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " × 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Rectangle
- Inner fabric
 - $1 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ "rectangle
- Scrap
 - $2-3" \times 1 \frac{1}{2}"$ for zipper tabs
- Interfacing
 - $2-2\frac{1}{4}$ " × $9\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - $2-4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - $2 3" \times 1 \frac{1}{2}"$
- Elastic
 - 7 ½" length (depends on the book)
- Zipper
 - 8 1/2" length of a 14" small nylon zipper



Prep



- Fold 2 of the 5" \times 10" (4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") pieces in half (hot dog style)
- Interface the inside of each rectangle by placing a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" ($2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ ") interfacing strip against the crease line
- Re-Press
- Inner fabric
 - Interface the back sides of the 5" \times 10" (4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") rectangles with interfacing
- Scrap
 - Interface each 3" x 1 ½" piece with interfacing





Zipper Assembly

- Trim and finish the zipper
 - Regardless of the size book caddy you choose to make, you will need to prep the 9" or 8 ½" zipper with tabs on top and bottom.
 - Cut the tabs in half after they've been prepped with interfacing
 - Measuring 1 ½" square each
 - Stitch the Zipper in between two tabs using 1/4" foot and seam allowance
 - Trim Sides to measure zipper width if necessary



Assembly



- Center the zipper under each side of the folded and interfaced book caddy front
- Use a zipper foot to stitch down each side of the zipper close to the folded edge
- Trim zipper tabs if necessary



Assembly



- Pin the elastic into position
- If you have a book in mind for your book caddy, adjust the elastic accordingly.
 - It's better for the elastic to be snug rather than loose.
- Unzip the zipper
- Place the back and lining wrong sides together
- Stitch all the way around the book caddy
- Clip corners



Optional Seam Finish



- Use a serger to save the edges inside your book caddy
- Otherwise, a zig zag stitch on your sewing machine will work
