# Watch the YouTube Video

Before you cut or start sewing, gently starch with Terial Magic

After the fabric dries, press with steam and cut the solid-like fabric to the 14" square size

You do not need to starch the lining (essex linen)



#### Cutting Instructions

- Background for Dresden Block
  - (1) 18" Square
- Pillow Back
  - (1) 18" Square
- Wedges
  - For 12 wedge ruler
    - Cut 1 strip of each fat quarter 8 1/2" Width of Fat Quarter
    - Use wedge to cut 3 each of four fat quarters
  - For 16 wedge ruler
    - Cut 1 strip of each fat quarter 8 ½" Width of Fat Quarter
    - Use wedge to cut 4 each of four fat quarters
  - For 20 wedge ruler
    - Cut 1 strip of each fat quarter 8 ½" Width of Fat Quarter
    - Use wedge to cut 5 each of four fat quarters
  - For 24 wedge ruler
    - Cut 1 strip of each fat quarter 8 ½" Width of Fat Quarter
    - Use wedge to cut 6 each of four fat quarters
- Cut center circle to taste






## Basic Wedge Assembly

#### Seam Allowance is 1/4"

- Fold each wedge in half right sides together
- Stitch the top
- Turn inside out
- Chain stitch



#### **Sew Wedges**

- Sew in pairs
- Then sew pairs together.
- Repeat until a circle is complete
- Press all seams open



### Applique Set-Up

- Use Stitch #1331 or a blind hem stitch
- If using the blind hem stitch
  - Set stitch width to 1.8mm, stitch length to 1.1mm and move the needle position all of the way to the right
  - Engage needle down
  - Use the Free Hand System to easily lift the presser foot to pivot.



#### Zipper Detais

- Use a straight stitch the sew the bottom of the back to the bottom of the front with a ½" Seam allowance 2" in from either side (¼" foot is fine)
- Press the pillow front seam allowance ½"
- Press the pillow back ¼"
- This provides a 14" opening for the zipper
- Attach zipper foot
  - Move needle position accordingly
- Top stitch according to the video

#### Details for Alternative Table Runner


Prepare your wedges for a 12" finished Block.

Experiment with different degree Wedges.

The table runner is 3 12" finished blocks set on point with setting triangles.

From Alexander Henry Haunted
House: Kiki's Coven – Violet
Cut 1, 18 ¼" Square then cut twice
on the diagonal

Cut 3, 12 ½" squares for Dresden wedge backgrounds.





Details for Alternative Table Runner

Sew the purple setting triangles to the Dresden plate blocks in rows, then sew the rows together.

NOTE: There are no triangels sewn to the two end pieces, this creates a point on each end of the table runner.

Quilt and bind to your liking



## Details for round Placemat

- Make wedges for a 16" 18" Dresden Plate
- Add center with your favorite method
- Layer Dresden on one layer of batting
- Quilt as desired
- Cut 2, 20" x 12" pieces for backing
  - Stitch these two pieces, leaving a 10" opening for turning.
  - Press to one side
- Place the item above right side up
  - Layer the Dresden plate right side down
  - Stitch around the plate
    - Clip seams and turn inside out
    - Hand sew the opening closed
