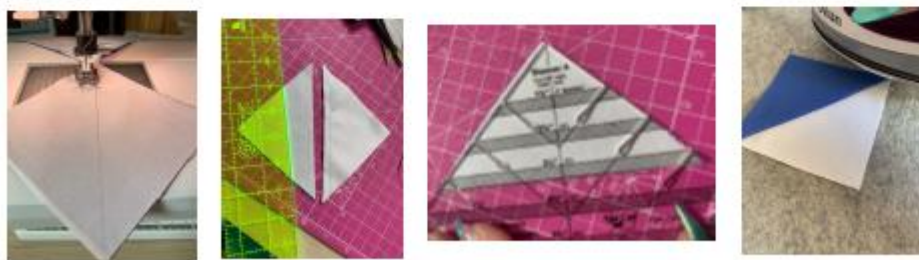
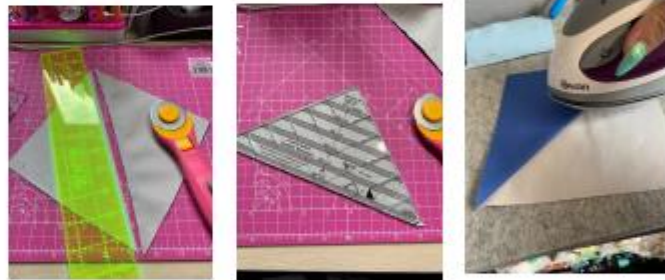


Draw a diagonal line onto the lighter colour of each pair of fabrics. You will have two pairs of fabric 2 and 5, 8 pairs of fabric 2 and 6 and 8 pairs of fabric 2 and 7.



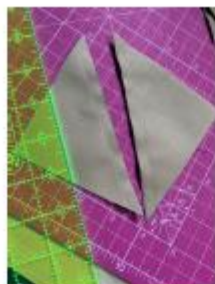
Stitch a seam 1/4" from the marked line on both sides of the fabric 2 and 5 pairs.

Cut apart along the marked line and square each HST to 6 1/2". We've used the clearly perfect slotted trimmer for this but use the method of your choice. Press towards the dark side.



Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line on the fabric 2 and 6 pairs. Cut apart along the marked line and square each GST to 3 1/2". Press to the dark side.





Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line on the fabric 2 and 7 pairs. Cut apart along the marked line and square each GST to 3 1/2". Press to the dark side.



Lay out the four patch squares referring to your layout plan, sew the top pair together, then the bottom pair together. Press each pair towards the darker fabric.

Check the orientation, nest the centre seams and sew together to create the four patch. Repeat 4 times to create 4 identical units. Press each flat.



Lay out the first set of chevrons (note there are 2 directions of these in the block!) sew each top and bottom pair together, then nest the seams and join to create the block. Make 4 of these units. Pressing each one.



Repeat the process but this time the fabrics have switched sides.  
Check your orientation plan before sewing together.

Lay out one quadrant.  
Join the top pair and  
the bottom pair  
together and then  
nest any seams  
together before joining  
and pressing flat.  
Make 4 of these units.



Join the top two blocks together  
with the rectangle of fabric 1.



Press the unit once completed.  
Repeat to make the bottom  
half checking orientation on  
your plan.







Create the centre strip by sewing the square of fabric 4 to a strip of fabric 1 on each side using 1/4" seam. Press flat.



Add the centre strip to your blocks making sure to nest the centre seams.

Once top and bottom have been joined press the block flat.



Congratulations you are now ready to begin assembling your quilt. Diagrams for this are in your pattern booklet.
