Bloomfield Galleries - celebrating 50 years!

It was in May 1973 that the Bloomfield Galleries opened in Crows Nest with the first mixed exhibition opening on 15 July. Lin moved from a very small country town in the middle of NSW with a love of art, fierce determination and the mind of a business woman. Fifty years later, her gallery is now managed by her two daughters, Jane and Bec, and, although changed greatly, we are still representing Norman Lindsay and Frank Hinder as our major artists, sprinkled with other prominent Australian artists. The gallery was launched in Crows Next, moved to Paddington in 1980, North Sydney in 1995 and Bungendore in 2000.

We've survived a difficult start in the early '70s, the crash of '87, a global recession, the GST, the Global Financial Crisis and Covid but we are still here. It's been a great 50 years (for the most part) and in our next newsletter, we'll showcase some of the artists we showed and some of our more unusual exhibitions.

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Norman Lindsay Facsimile Etchings

The Norman Lindsay Facsimile Etchings were first launched on 30 November 1974 with the release of what are now called "The First Eleven". We thought that it would be a once only release and just those eleven works, but demand was such that discerning buyers were looking for high quality reproductions of Norman Lindsay's work at prices they could afford. At that time, the original works were priced out of reach for most people. In 1978 a further six Facsimile Etchings were released and the rest, as they say, is history.

To date, we have released 121 Facsimile Etchings since 1974. *The Artist* was originally released in the de luxe edition of *The Complete Etchings of Norman Lindsay*, published in 1998, but is now available individually.

Lin, Bec and I have been discussing a fitting conclusion for the Facsimile Etchings and we feel that we should end the editions next year, with the celebration of 50 years of Odana Editions, the publishing arm which has published the Facsimiles since 1974 and books since 1978. Consequently, we will release four more Facsimile Etchings, making a total of 125 (we do have a thing with 5s!) releases over a span of 50 years.

Towards the end of this year, we will be releasing (*Celebration*) in keeping with our 50 Year Celebrations and also *The Bride*. Next year, to celebrate Odana's 50 Years and to conclude the publication of the Facsimile Etchings, the releases will be *The Happy Barge* and *Good Night*.

125 Facsimile Etchings over 50 years with the first being *Enter the Magicians* and the last, *Good Night*. How fortunate we are to have been able to showcase so many of Norman Lindsay's etchings and to have so many art collectors able to purchase them. We don't have details as yet as to prices or an order form but as soon as these are available, we will advise.


Please note: Due to the quality and success of the Norman Lindsay Facsimile Etchings, fraudulent copies were made in the 1990s and sold through auction houses. Also, pages out of books are commonly claimed to be Facsimile Etchings. To ensure you have a genuine, authentic Norman Lindsay

Facsimile Etching published by Odana Editions (now Odana Bloomfield), please check that the embossed stamp is always visible on the lower right hand side of the image which looks like the one at right. The dot is always at the six o'clock position with the 550 in the middle and the words Facsimile Limited Edition around the outside.




Forgetiquette

Having a loved one with memory loss is no laughing matter, but a little humour can help. With her sage advice and trademark irreverence, Joan Sauers helps to relieve the frustration of dealing with dementia sufferers while offering practical advice that will help you help them. Above all, she reminds you that, though it may feel like the loneliest job in the world, you are not alone.

Joan writes: All relationships are hard, but when someone you love has dementia, that relationship (and your sanity!) can be even harder to maintain. Over the years my once quick-witted father gradually lost his memory and the strain on his caregivers was excruciating. As he neared the end of his life, my wonderful father-in-law also started to lose touch with the here and now. Both have passed away, and I miss them every day. Although it wasn't easy, I did find ways to cope with the confusing, awkward and sometimes heartbreaking situations that arose when dementia struck, and I've tried to distil them in this book. Thankfully, there are simple things you can do to get through it with grace and dignity. So, cut yourself some slack and remember that common sense, humour and love will go a long way.

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Lindsay on Canvas

We have a spectacular, larger than life, Norman Lindsay etching reproduced on canvas available at present. *Lady and Parrot*, the iconic etching of Rose Lindsay, looks modern, even though the image was etched in 1917. This Art Deco/Art Nouveau image is synonymous with Norman Lindsay and its appeal spans generations.

These days, houses seem to be built larger, more expansive and with more wall space than ever before. Larger art works with aesthetically pleasing images are being sought to fill these spaces.

Pictured below is *Lady and Parrot* above a king size bed and also above a 42" flat screen TV. This work is 90cm x 90cm and is commanding in its presence. Also available is a 60cm x 60cm size. To the right of the large *Lady and Parrot* is the Facsimile Etching of *Lady and Parrot* to give you perspective (in the bedroom image).
