
DOOMSLUG FINGER PUPPETS INSTRUCTIONS

Materials

- Style A and B Pattern Pieces
- Felt pieces
- Embroidery Floss
- Needle
- Scissors
- Iron

Stitches to know


Basic back stitch





Great for your outline stitch. Work from right to left. Bring needle out at Point 1, insert at Point 2 and come out at Point 3. The main thing with this stitch is to make sure that the distance between 1-3, and 1-2 is exactly the same. Repeat sequence for next stitch.


Basic chain stitch







Another great stitch for outlining objects or if worked in close rows for filling an area. Bring needle out at Point 1 and insert back into same hole at Point 1. Bring out at Point 2, carrying thread under needle point and then pull it through. Point 2 now becomes point 1 for your next stitch.

Basic blanket stitch





Great stitch for using on edges! Bring needle out at Point 1 (bottom line). Insert at Point 2 (on a slight diagonal) then come up at Point 3 directly below from Point 2. Repeat sequence but remember that Point 3 of previous stitch is now Point 1.



Style A

- 1. Cut out pattern with allowance around the outline
- 2. Iron pieces to chosen felt colors.






3. Cut along the lines on the pattern and felt






4. Place the Face piece on top of Back piece and sew on with either chain stitch or back stitch as desired 5mm within the edge of the face piece's edge.








5. Decorate as desired! You have your first puppet!



Style B

- 1. Cut out pattern with allowance around the outline.
- 2. Iron pieces to chosen felt colors.
- 3. Cut along the lines on the pattern and felt.





- 4. If desired, stitch a chain stich 5mm from the edge of the face felt piece.
- 5. Align the Face piece with the front of the Tendril piece. Sew along sides and top with either backstitch or chain stitch.






6. If desired, add blanket stitch along the bottom edge of the tendril piece near the finger opening.





7. Line up the tendril edges of the Back and Tendril pieces as shown. Stitch together along the edge with either back stitch or blanket stitch.





8. Tail portion of the Tendril piece will overlap each other as shown. There will be some excess that will be trimmed off once placement is established. Finish sewing overlapping tails and back together.
