Don't discount the designer of your dreams If you've always dreamed of walking down the aisle wearing Vera Wang or Monique Lhuillier, you should definitely go for it, says Sabatino. Most wedding dress designers design up to a size 20-24, even if they don't have plus-size lines separated in their collection. Some of them, such as Anna Mayer-Ulla-Maya, even make a custom measurement and fit the dress directly to the bride. One thing to know, however, is that sometimes designers can have an extra fabric charge after a certain size, especially if you get muslin made, too. Read more: How to find the perfect wedding dress for your Body Type Call salons in advance Although the size eight is a typical sample size for wedding dresses, some salons also carry styles of 14. Call ahead before you go to the store to see if they carry larger sized samples. Even if the dresses on the floor don't fit you perfectly, there are ways to appreciate what style will look like to you. There are ways to pin a sample of dresses for underwear that give a really good sense of what the dress will look like on, even if you're not in it, explains Sabatino. Or, if you can get the dress half, you can get a good feeling of what the lower silhouette looks like on your body type. My advice: don't discount the dress or shape until you've tried it. Also, let the salon know about your personal style as well as the time and place of your wedding - it will help the consultant pull options that will gel better with your personality in addition to your body type. Be open to different styles just as you should not let your form exclude you from your designer dreams and also don't let it over-dictate the style Yes, there are some silhouettes that you will find work better for your body shape, but you can surprise yourself with a variety of what you can wear. I've had so many crooked brides say they don't want a strapless dress, but then find a dress that suits them and gives them the right support, and nine times out of 10, they fall in love and end up with a strapless dress, says Sabatino. Wear wedding lingerie to the salon If you plan to wear Spanx, a special bra, or a long corset line on your wedding day, go to the salon with them, advises Sabatino. Supporting clothes can really change the shape of your body quite a bit, so make sure you bring them on fittings if you plan on wearing them on your wedding day. Buy a size that fits most of your body a lot of brides might think that buying a smaller wedding dress will motivate them to lose weight before the wedding, but the truth is that it just adds a lot of unnecessary stress. A consultant in the salon will measure you and offer the right size, she explains. And you always have to go with the biggest size. This means that if you bust measures a size 12 but your hips measure a size 18 - you should buy a dress of 18 and change it down to accommodate the rest of your body. Bring a shopping buddy who has your interests in mind, if you're going to shop with a friend, bring someone who's going to give you as impartial an opinion as possible, advises Sabatino. You want your trading buddy to be someone you trust and someone who listens and supports you but isn't going to over-sugar coat things or try to influence you in decisions that you might not feel comfortable with. Looking for an option that will hug your curves in all the right places? Hall says it's the perfect way for the bride to accentuate her shape by helping to create curves. The bride may think she doesn't have a waist, but a bodice on top can cut one out, Hall says. The fall waist dress allows you to have some fullness at the bottom of the dress as well as accentuating the hips in a flattering manner. Choose a timeless ball gown that highlights the most slender area of your torso-your waist! Ballroom dresses are an excellent choice for pear-shaped brides as they show off your smaller top half with abundant fabrics at the bottom. Regardless of your body type, a ball gown will make anyone feel like a princess. According to Laurie Conley, general merchandise manager at BHLDN, if a full ball gown is what you're going after, then Oleg Cassini is a great designer option. The line is known for its luxurious, glamorous princess ball gowns (think Jackie Kennedy's wedding dress) and has many dresses specifically cut to flatter fuller figures, she says. Work with the tailor to make sure that the flair begins flair fair above the knees to give the illusion of longer legs. As far as designers look, Hall offers Lazaro and Dennis Basso. Lazaro is a particularly good choice for brides who love beading and lace embellishments throughout, says Hall. Another designer who specializes in mermaid shapes for fuller figures is Dennis Basso. In addition to designing a large mermaid shape, Dennis Basso is also known for his ruching and the use of dreamy organza fabrics, which are both very flattering on plus-size brides. Dresses are fitted and accentuate the waist. The trumpet wedding dress is very similar to the mermaid dress- both options have a curve-hugging silhouette that flares up at the bottom of the dress. Designer Pnina Tornai creates many dresses with these built-in corsets, and dresses are favorites among plus size brides, according to the audience. Her designs are known for their built-in corsets, which give great support, accentuate the waist, and cut figure for full-time brides, he says. This pattern brings the eyes to the face and creates a vertical shape of the dress, he says. Avoid dresses that look together. For example, a bodice is one style and then a hip or skirt has completely different fabrics or textures. Different shapes or fabrics that don't smoothly transition can visually shorten the body in unflattering ways, says Hall. This does not mean that the whole dress should be the same fabric, but make sure that each section sequesters smoothly and flows together. Hall recommends looking for dresses that have asymmetrical details that are not only more flattering, but artistically and unique. The asymmetrical hemline will draw the eye down and create a fullness at the bottom of the dress that will balance the fullness on the upper or middle part of the body. The hall suggests avoiding thin fabrics such as silk charm or chiffon, which is just a low-fat body and can enlarge every little thing. But other than that, feel free to go for anything. Tafta, organza, lace and duchess satin are all very flattering fabric choices. If there's ever a time that a bride should wear what she likes when it comes to fashion, she should be on her wedding day, says Hall.
