Welcome to the 2021 release of our Icons and Limited Edition wines,

The 2018 and 2019 vintages are the first two in a run of exceptional years for Hawke's Bay wines.

When we are blessed by Mother Nature, the stars align and we get the perfect combination of benign Spring weather, with no frosts to damage young buds or shoots, followed by a warm and dry summer with just enough rain, leading to an Indian summer for the critical Autumn ripening period where settled mild weather helps build up the layers of flavours and sugars in the grapes, before a ideal harvest in dry conditions. These conditions do not occur every year, but when they do, we are able to produce our top tiers of wines: Icon and Limited Edition.

In this offer we are pleased to release our 2018 reds, two in the Icon range: Hieronymus and Airavata which are the absolute pinnacles of Elephant Hill's Bordeaux style red blends, and Syrah, respectively. These are the most hedonistic and refined expressions of these varieties that we produce.

And three 2018 Stone reds in our Limited Edition range: a STONE Syrah, and rare bottlings of STONE Cabernet Sauvignon and STONE Cabernet Franc. Our Stone wines all come from our Gimblett Gravels vineyard and they are wines that really reflect the place they were grown, they are a voice of the vineyard, distinctive and characterful. 2018 was a phenomenal year for the Cabernet varieties so we decided to bottle small volumes of the two single varietals Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc separately, as the wines were simply so good we did not want to blend them all into the Hieronymus.

For Chardonnay lovers, we have our two 2019 whites; Salomé from the Icon range and the SEA Chardonnay. Both wines were produced in limited volumes this year with the Salomé being the 'best of the best' of our Chardonnay, our most luxurious bottling, While the Sea Chardonnay is a unique and distinctive expression of this variety grown in our coastal vineyard by the Pacific Ocean, with more freshness, saline and oyster shell characters weaved into the wine. Something for everyone...

Salomé Chardonnay is named after a famous ancestor of the Weiss family, who own Elephant Hill. Maria Salome Ebner von Eschenbach lived near Nuremburg in Germany in the early 1700s.

Hand-harvested Chardonnay grapes were whole bunch pressed and the juice briefly settled before being racked into a selection of French Burgundy barriques. Fermented with indigenous wild yeasts. Extended time on lees added textural elements before a limited bottling of this excellent vintage for Chardonnay.

Fantastic bouquet, intense and seductive, fruity and complex with aromas of cashew nut and smoky oak, new wood and baked stone fruits, vanilla and burnt butter, some honey and leesy spice layers. On the palate - full bodied, full flavoured, rich and intense, complex and intriguing, textured and engaging. A delicious wine that's more than just a mouthful - with fine wood tannins, a lees spice, a core of fruit and velvet cream texture. Best drinking from 2022 through 2028+

From the Triangle and Te Awanga vineyards, this wine is only produced in exceptional vintages like 2019. Rich, creamy chardonnay with citrus, grapefruit, peach, ginger, toasted nut, hazelnut and spicy oak flavours. This is an exceptional chardonnay with promising cellaring potential.

Immensely complex and engaging, the bouquet shows apricot, grapefruit, subtle flint, spicy oak and oatmeal characters, followed by a powerfully concentrated palate offering outstanding depth and persistency. Seductive and plush, while remaining structured and harmonious. At its best: now to 2031.

This is a taut and complex Chardonnay of strength and elegance, packed with details of lemon, pineapple, minerality and toasty oak elements, on a powerful drive with balanced acidity.

Bright, light lemon/green, with a highly fragrant, complex bouquet, it is mouthfilling and vibrantly fruity, with ripe stone-fruit flavours, showing excellent delicacy and concentration, finely integrated toasty oak, fresh acidity, and a poised, tightly structured, long finish. A classic cellaring style, it should break into full stride 2023+.

The Icon range is the pinnacle of our winemaking. They are fine and rare wines made in strictly limited quantities.

Our top Cabernet Merlot blend is named after a famous ancestor of the Weiss family, who own Elephant Hill, Hieronymus Ebner von Eschenbach, Lord Mayor of Nuremberg 1512-1524.

The grapes were hand harvested from very low yielding vines, over ten separate picks, hand sorted in the vineyard and again in the winery, then fermented in separate batches in wooden cuves before draining to barrel without pressing.

Matured in French oak barriques and bottled with minimal fining and filtration.

Incredible perfume and concentration with aromas of dark berries and spice, smoked vanilla, clove and all-spice with sweet new wood scents and a core of sun-baked stones. As the wine touches the palate a flavour explosion unfolds with a deep core of fruit, ripeness and concentration. Blackcurrant and blackberry, cassis and preserved plums, there's a dark violet and boot-polish inky quality then flavours of baked bell-pepper and tobacco.

Offering precision and impeccable detail, as well as profound power and presence, the wine is packed with crème de cassis, sweet cherry, cigar box and espresso characters with a charming floral overtone. Substantial and sophisticated with an immensely long engaging finish.

The Icon range is the pinnacle of our winemaking. They are fine and rare wines made in strictly limited quantities.

Our top Syrah is named after the King-God of Elephants called Airavata, the scared white elephant in Hindu mythology.

Hand-picked Syrah from low yielding vines was batch fermented, with regular hand plunging, for 14-21 days before draining to barrel, some new, some seasoned for an extended period of maturation, with no racking of barrels.

Bottled with very minimal fining and filtration.

A complex wine that delivers on intensity and power as much as it does variety, spice, a core of fruit and layers of flavour and mouthfeel. Red currant and raspberry, red licorice and barrel spices of clove and bacon. Firm youthful tannins and a backbone of acidity hold all the flavours in place ready to age and harmonise. This wine may be three years young already but will age well for the next 3-5 years before it is complete. Be quick! Buy now and cellar till late 2024 and enjoy through 2030+

This compelling Syrah, shows dark berry, smoky bacon, tapenade, elegant oak and subtle cocoa aromas, leading to a graciously opulent palate offering outstanding depth and concentration. Multi-layered and seamless with a totally seductive finish. At its best: 2024 to 2040.

Flagship Syrah from the Gimblett Gravels district. Elegance on a grand scale with violet, floral, plum, dark cherry and berry, black pepper and spicy oak flavours. Surprisingly accessible but with plenty of cellaring potential.

This is a well-structured, taut Syrah with considerably fine tannin structure, mineral complexity and opulent fruit. Match with venison loins and wild boar over the next 10-15 years.

An emerging star. Deeply coloured, with a fragrant, slightly earthy bouquet, it is mouthfilling, savoury and supple, with deep, plummy, spicy flavours, showing excellent ripeness, complexity and harmony. Still youthful, but already delicious, it's well worth cellaring to 2023+.

Beneath the initial aromas of sweet French oak and raw cashew nut, a whiff of white smoke and baking spice lies a core of pure white and yellow fleshed stone fruits. Apricot and peach, ripe red apple and grapefruit. A complex youthful bouquet. On the palate - a wine of texture then flavour, dry and weighty, a coarse silk texture with acidity and freshness, a moment of gun-flint then fine tannins and flavours of fruit that reflect the bouquet. Complex, balanced, youthful and well made. Best drinking from 2022 through 2028+.

Wonderfully fruited and gorgeously complex, showing golden peach, baked fig, vanillin oak and brioche characters on the nose with a hint of lemon zest. The palate displays excellent weight and richly textured mouthfeel, backed by bright acidity, finishing impressively long and satisfying. At its best: now to 2027.

Intense, elegant chardonnay with an appropriately saline oyster-shell character together with citrus, lemon curd, green apple and subtle nutty oak flavours. Nice purity and impressive power.

This elegant Chardonnay is refined and persistent with the delicate complexity of barrel fermentation and coastal influence. Match with crayfish and grilled calamari over the next 5-8 years.

Estate-grown at Te Awanga, the very stylish 2019 vintage (5*) was fermented and matured for a year in French oak barriques (30 per cent new). Bright, light lemon/green, it is fragrant and youthful, with citrusy, mealy, biscuity flavours, fresh acidity, and impressive complexity, delicacy, vigour and intensity. A classic cellaring style, it's well worth cellaring to 2023+

The Limited Edition releases comprise our single vineyard element wines of 'EARTH', 'SEA' & 'STONE'.

The SEA wines are grown beside the winery at Te Awanga, within a couple hundred metres of the Pacific Ocean. The coastal influence produces wines that are refreshing and beautifully aromatic, with a distinct, saline mineral edge.

The Chardonnay grapes were hand harvested, then whole-bunch pressed and the juice briefly settled before being run to new and seasoned French oak barrique to mature for a year. Minimal malolactic fermentation. Extra time spent on lees adds to the mid palate richness and texture while balancing the wine's racy freshness.

Strictly limited volumes were bottled from the fabulous 2019 vintage.

This is a serious Cabernet Sauvignon that displays varietal characters, fine use of oak and a strong sense of place expression.

Classically structured and concentrated, the wine shows cassis, floral, tobacco and spicy oak aromas on the nose, followed by a superbly weighted palate displaying stunning fruit intensity combined with spicy nuances, finishing wonderfully persistent and sturdy. At its best: now to 2036.

Deep-tinted and tantalisingly aromatic cabernet sauvignon with cassis, dark berry, dried herb, black olive, chocolate-mocha and spicy oak flavours. Can be appreciated now but will clearly benefit from careful cellaring.

Flavours of black currant then tart blackberry, tobacco and dried hay along with salivating and lightly salty mouthfeel counter-balance tannins with ease and allows the flavours of cassis and violets to ease through on the finish. Well worth discovering, the finely crafted 2018 vintage was estate-grown in the Gimblett Gravels and matured for nearly two years in French oak barriques. A concentrated, intensely varietal and highly approachable red, it's already delicious.

Beautiful elegant wine with superb complexity and attack.

The Syrah and Viognier grapes were co-fermented in wooden cuves. Just 1% of Viognier adds a beautiful aromatic lift to the final wine. Gentle hand plunging before ageing in French oak barrique and bottled with minimal filtration and no fining.

A dense, rich and multi-layered Syrah with elegance and exquisite balance. Drink now or keep.

This is an elegant Cabernet Franc with the depth of black fruit and herbaceous elements enriched by smoky cedar and a firm, fine-grained tannin structure. Match with herb-crusted lamb and beef wellington over the next 8+ years.

This is a magnificent rendition of the variety, showing blackcurrant, dark cherry, thyme and cedary oak characters with a hint of game. The palate delivers gorgeously rounded mouthfeel and excellent power, together with beautifully polished mouthfeel and fine tannins, leading to a structured yet refine finish. At its best: now to 2036.

A captivating bouquet with a touch of mystery and intrigue. Aromas of violets then black cherry, ligurian olive and dark chocolate, baking spices and toasty barrel then a touch of sweet tobacco and dried herb. On the palate - fantastic with a concentration of flavours that meld the aromas together. Firm tannins and noticeable acid line, velvet and chalky mouthfeel with long finish. A delicious wine. Cabernet Franc is normally a component of our best red blends but the 2018 was so exceptional for this variety that we have bottled a one-off, small batch as a single varietal wine. It is an elegant and fragrant expression of the variety, and rarely produced.
