- 1. Who governs your life? The world or the Lord? Are there times when you find it easier to follow the world's norms and rules? If so, why? (Lesson 1)
- 2. Why did the Pharisees think that Jesus was working for the devil? (Lesson 2)
- 3. It's not always easy to tell the difference between a blade of wheat and a weed. How do can you know the difference? How can you know the difference between people who are sincere in their faith walk and others who are more talk than action? (Lesson 3)
- 4. Just like plants need water and sunlight to grow, human beings need exercise, food, and water to grow physically. What do we need to grow spiritually? (Lesson 4)
- 5. The lesson talks about heaven. What does heaven look like to you? How did you formulate that image? (Lesson 5)
- 6. Do you have a hard time practicing the fruits of the Spirit? Which one(s) in particular do you have difficulty adhering to? (Lesson 6)
- 7. Verse 12 says, "So that each of us will be accountable to God." Does that verse frighten or concern you? Why or why not? Explain your answer. (Lesson 7)
- 8. Are you quick to judge someone based solely on appearance? Have you ever incorrectly judged someone based on their outward appearance. Share your experience with the class and then discuss how believers can break that habit? (Lesson 8)
- 9. Think before you answer: Who is the Second Adam? (Lesson 9)
- 10. Nowadays, it is common practice to wash our hands before we eat. Why were the Pharisees upset that Jesus' disciples did not wash their hands before eating? Why did they question Jesus about it and why was the Pharisees' response hypocritical? (Lesson 10)
- 11. Is it possible to do good at the wrong time? Explain your response and find biblical support for your answer. (Lesson 11)

- 12. Why is so important for those teaching the word of God, to take that responsibility seriously? (Lesson 12)
- 13. Instead of judging others we should look at ourselves first. Identify ways you can do this. Do you use the same "measuring stick" to judge yourself that you use for others? Explain your response. (Lesson 13)
