For this question, keep in mind that the city of Jericho, like many other cities in the Middle East, was built in levels, with people building new layers of things on top of old layers of things, so that a hill (tel) is formed. Let's say that you were digging in Jericho and did start to find a lot of things made from bronze, iron, gold and silver. There are basically two explanations for that happening. Please describe the two basic reasons that explain why you are starting to find objects of this type. Which reason would you choose as being correct (yes, this is a tough one!)?
15.	Perhaps the main reason that Kathleen Kenyon made incorrect conclusions about the Jericho site is because she was expecting to see certain items there, but as far as she knew, none of those items were present at the site. Although the absence of something you expect to find at a site can help to confirm what you are already thinking about the archaeological evidence, it is usually considered methodologically unsound to rely exclusively on the absence of information to drive scientific conclusions. Why do you think that making definitive conclusions based upon NOT finding an artifact somewhere that you think you should is scientifically dangerous?
16.	I think the coolest thing about the Jericho excavation is the finding that there was a small section of the wall that had not fallen down. All the rest was fallen, but not that small section. Why is that so cool? (Joshua 2 might help you to answer, as well as keeping in mind the concept that the Bible making certain predictions about what might be found at a biblical archaeological dig.)
