

Easyboot Fury Glue-On Frequently Asked Questions

Q What is the difference between the Easyboot Fury Glue-On and Easyboot Glue-on?

A The Easyboot Fury Glue-On is a longer shell that can add additional heel support. The heel is open on the Easyboot Fury Glue-On and closed on an Easyboot Glue-On. The Easyboot Fury Glue-On has a more aggressive tread and a slot that accepts an EVA heel pad.

Q If my horse wears a size 1 Easyboot, what is the comparable size?

A The sizing for the Fury Glue-On is completely different than our other boots. You will need to re-measure your horse in millimeters and look at the size chart. Glue-On boots come in both whole and half sizes.

Q How do I determine the correct size boot and what is a Fit Kit?

A To ensure you purchase the correct size, we recommend that you order a Fit Kit. The Fury Kit comes with three boots—the size you think you need and a half size on either side. There are complete instructions and photos showing how the boot should fit.

Q How do I know what size Fit Kit to order?

A A Fit Kit gives you the size you think you need plus a half size on either side. Measure your horse after a fresh trim and look at the size chart for the Fury. You will want to go by your horse's width. If your horse measures a size #1.5 in width you will need to order a size #1.5 Fit Kit. This will give you a size #1, a #1.5 and a #2 boot.

Q What if I am more than one size apart?

A Purchase the size that corresponds to the width. The extra length can be removed with a belt sander, nippers or rasp.

Q What is involved in the process of applying an Easyboot Fury Glue-On?

A You will need additional accessories including Vettec Adhere, Vettec mixing tips, Vettec glue gun, gloves, a rasp, and a heat gun.

Q What adhesive do you use?

A Vettec Adhere and Sikaflex 227.

Q Where can I find a heat gun?

A Horse Gear Canada does not sell heat guns. However, affordable heat guns can be found at most hardware stores.

Q How long can you keep the boots on?

A We recommend no longer than 5 days in a wet environment and 10 days in a dry environment.

Q What if my horse needs a different size boot for every foot?

A Because the sizing is so precise, it is possible that there will be horses with different sizes for each foot. Again, your best bet is to order a Fit Kit so you can double-check your measurements.

Q How many uses will I get out of the boots?

A Generally, you will only get one use out of your boots, unless you diligently remove all the glue after use. We recommend using a circular wire brush on a drill press.

Q What's the process to remove Easyboot Fury Glue-On shells?

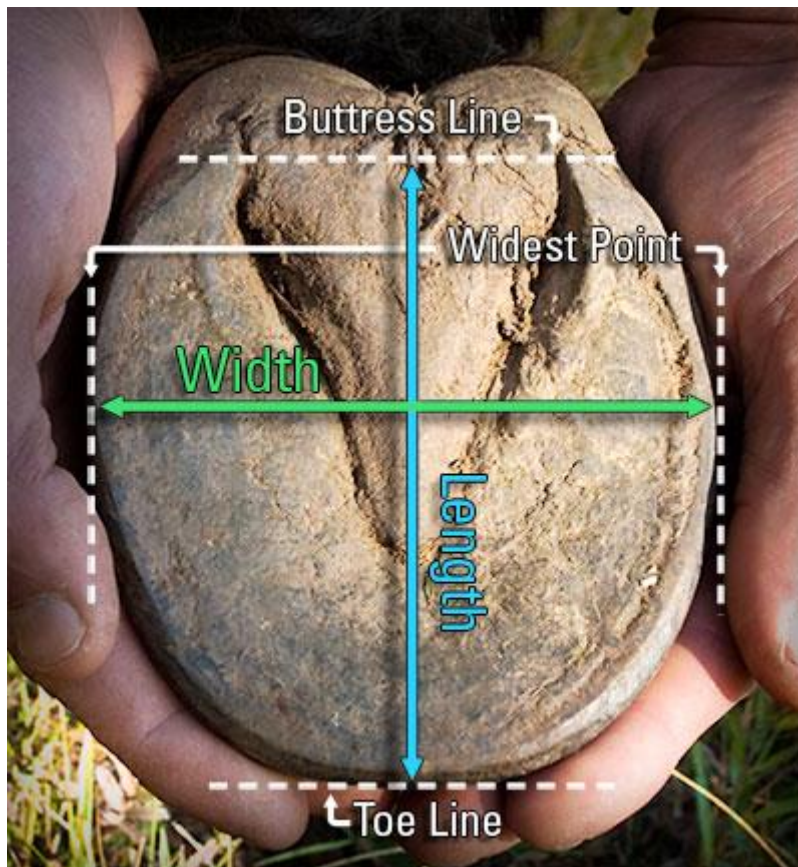

How to Properly Measure Your Horse's Hoof

We cannot over stress the importance of resizing! You wouldn't go for a jog in ill-fitting sneakers, so why would you expect your horse to do the same?



1. After a fresh trim, measure the width of the hoof across the bottom at the widest point.
 2. Measure the length of the hoof from the toe to the buttress line of the heel. The buttress line is the farthest weight bearing point of the heel where the hoof wall ends. Do not include the heel bulbs in the measurement.
 3. Compare your measurement with the appropriate size chart. Please note that each boot style has its own unique size chart.
 4. Ideally, the length and width measurement will fit into the same size. If the length and width measurements indicate different sizes, select the larger size. If the hoof measurements fall closely to the maximum length or width, we recommend choosing the next size up. If the width and length measurements are different by more than one size, your selected boot style is not recommended. * Be sure to check your measurements against an alternative boot in the EasyCare line—another style may accommodate your horse's hoof shape better.
- *Note: If you are fitting an Easyboot Glue-On or Glove, width and length must fall into the same size category.
