## Free Pattern Instructions

### 5 Fat Quarters Woven Pillow

Decorative pillows are easy and affordable to create; adding personalized, finishing touches to your home décor. Pick five fat quarters of fabrics that catch your eye, and in an afternoon you'll have a beautiful, new accessory for your favorite room. Approximate Finished Size: 17½" square pillow

#### Supplies Needed:

- Five fat quarters (each rectangle approximately 18" x 21")
- 18" square pillow form
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " covered button forms
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yd. fusible batting
- Coordinating all-purpose thread
- 12 wt. thread or buttonhole thread
- · Optional: Scrap of lightweight fusible interfacing


#### Helpful Notions:

- Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" piecing foot, such as Little Foot<sup>®</sup> or Patchwork Foot
- Tailor's Clapper
- 10" or 12" upholstery needle
- Wonder Clips
- · Point turning tool, such as Point 2 Point Turner
- Optional: Starch or starch alternative, such as Best Press<sup>™</sup> Starch Alternative
- Optional: Showcase Throw Pillow Corner Template

#### **Instructions:**


*Read all instructions before beginning the project. All seam allowances are ¼" unless otherwise stated.* 

- 1. Prepare and cut fabrics:
  - Optional: Stabilize all fabrics well with spray starch or starch alternative. Let fabric dry completely before folding and cutting.
  - From each fat quarter cut:
    - One 18" square.
    - Reserve remaining strips for covered buttons.





- Cut one 18" square from fusible batting.
- 2. Layer and fuse pillow backing:
  - Choose one of the 18" squares for the back of the pillow.
  - Fuse square of batting to wrong side of the backing fabric square, following manufacturer's instructions.
- 3. Prepare folded pillow top:
  - Fold remaining four squares diagonally, corner to corner with wrong sides together, and aligning the cut edges.






• Press. Immediately place a Tailor's Clapper on the pressed edge. The clapper quickly absorbs heat and moisture, setting the pressed fold.




4. Layer, weave, and stitch pillow:

Note: Labeling the triangles 1–4 will help identify which ones to work with when weaving the triangles.


- Place backing on work surface, right side up.
- Pin or Wonder Clip Triangle 1 to the backing, aligning left and lower edges.
- Pin or clip Triangle 2 over the Triangle 1, aligning lower and right edges.




• Pin or clip Triangle 3 over the Triangle 2, aligning right and upper edges.



• Pin or clip Triangle 4 over the Triangle 1, aligning upper and left edges.




• Weave triangles by lifting lower corner of the Triangle 4, lifting upper corner of the Triangle 1 and placing the lower corner of Triangle 4 under Triangle 1, meeting cut edges of backing. Pin or clip edges in place.



• Optional: Trim pillow corners using the Showcase Throw Pillow Corner Template to prevent "dog ears".


*Note: "Dog ears" are the oddly shaped pointy corners that can occur when making square-cornered pillows* 




- Stitch along each side of the pillow. Clip corners to reduce bulk.
- 5. Turn pillow to right side through woven triangles. Use a point turning tool to gently shape corners; press.
- 6. Add pillow form and adjust triangles. Tack the pillow center where the four triangle folds intersect.



- 7. Complete the pillow with covered buttons:
  - Cover two 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" diameter covered button forms:
    - Select two fabrics from the reserved strips.
    - Cut an approximate 4" square from each fabric.
    - Cut two scant 4" squares from remaining fusible batting, or fusible interfacing scraps.
    - Fuse batting or interfacing squares to wrong sides of the fabric squares, following manufacturer's instructions.





- Assemble covered buttons following manufacturer's instructions.

- Attach buttons to pillow:
  - Use a long upholstery needle, threaded with 12 wt. thread or buttonhole thread, to pierce through the pillow center.
  - Sew both buttons to center of pillow, one on each side, making the pillow reversible.



- Tie a secure knot, hidden beneath one of the buttons. Clip thread tails approximately ½" long, checking that they are also hidden by the button.
