- Verify that re.brostrend.com or 192.168.0.254 is correctly entered in the address bar of your browser. Please do NOT enter re.brostrend.com or 192.168.0.254 in the search bar of your browser.
- Use another WEB browser and try again.

# Q3: How to reset the extender back to factory default settings?

When the PWR LED of the extender is solid on, press the RESET button on the extender with a needle. After the PWR LED turns solid on again, the extender is reset to factory default settings.

### Q4: The extender cannot find the Wi-Fi network of my router. What should I do?

- The router may be encrypted with WEP or WPA/WPA (Enterprise) algorithm. Change the encryption type of the router to WPA-PSK or WPA2-PSK, and try scanning again.
- Change the Wi-Fi channel of your existing router and try again.
