"Once upon a time a wine like this would have been overloaded with thick, syrupy oak. This wine is not. It's both deep and fresh, its blackcurrant fruit flavours freshened with boysenberry and mint, its tobacco nuances complemented by woodsmoke and cedar. The tannin here is ultra fine but, yet, strung from the mid-palate onwards, and as we all know: the earlier the tannin starts, in the context of balance, the better. There are some volatile characters on the nose here but they don't detract; this is a terrific wine, fresh, confident, medium in weight, and sustained."
