### **Fabric Requirements:**

4"X4"Brown Trunks

10" X10" Globe

4"X 8" Base

3 of 3"X 8" Trees

.3m fusible web

16" zipper

20"X 20" pillow back

3" X 20" accent strip for pillow back

6" X wof borders

20" X 20" muslin for backing

## Required:

20" X 20" square of the batting of your choice

16" pillow form



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# Snow Globe Applique 16"Pillow Cover






# Instructions:

### **Applique Preparation**

- 1. Trace the applique pieces on the paper side of the fusible web.
- 2. Cut around the pieces on the web, leaving at least a ¼" outside of the drawn lines.
- 3. Place fusible pieces to appropriate fabrics.
- 4. Fuse without steam with a medium iron for 4-6 seconds.
- 5. Cut out on the lines.
- 6. Score the paper backing with a pin to create an opening in the paper for easy removal.

### **Pillow Front**

- 1. Cut pillow front 12½" square lining up the print on the fabric with the lines on the rulers
  - to make your piece square with the print.
- 2. Cut 2 of each border pieces 2½" X 12½" and 2½" X 16½".
- 3. Add the short borders to opposite sides of the pillow front.
- 4. Press towards the borders.
- 5. Repeat on the other edges with the longer strips.









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- 21. Open the zipper before you pin through all layers.
- 22. Stitch around the pillow using ¼" seam allowance.
- 23. Turn pillow through the zipper opening.
- 24. Press seam so the pillow lies flat.
- 25. Stuff pillow into case. Zip up.
- 26. Enjoy!







- 5. Layer the 18-20" batting square between the pillow top and the 20" square pillow backing (muslin, this will be inside the pillow cover)
- 6. Quilt as desired.
- 7. Position the snow globe applique pieces in the center of your background fabric.
- 8. Use a ruler to align the snow globe base with the border.
- 9. Fuse into place.
- 10. Use a narrow zig-zag or a straight stitch to sew down each of the applique pieces.

### **Pillow Back**


- 1. Cut the pillow back to 16½" X 16½" square.
- 2. Decide on a split and cut horizontally across. The example is just North of the halfway mark.
- 3. Cut accent strip 161/2" X 21/2"
- 4. Cut 2 tabs 1"X3".
- 5. Fold the accent strip in half and press.







6. Add tab to each end of the zipper. Place right side of tab to right side of zipper. Place tabs just inside of the metal stops at each end.



7. Stitch across a few times to secure.



8. Trim off excess zipper.





9. Pin the zipper, right sides together, to the top of the bottom pillow back section. The tabs may extend past the pillow section. (Check the direction of the fabric.)




10. Stitch with a ¼" seam allowance.



11. Press away from the zipper.

12. Top stitch.







14. Once pinned, open the zipper about one third to keep the zipper pull away from presser foot. Stitch a 1/4" seam

allowance until you get about a quarter of the way. Lift the presser foot and close the zipper.





- 15. Continue sewing to the end.
- 16. Press away from zipper and topstitch.



18. Layer the pillow top with the pillow back watching that both are facing the right direction.



- 19.To make the corners of the pillow snug in, use a corner cut template. Download the template and trace to template plastic. Cut out the shape of the template on the line.



20. Lay the corner template so that the straight edges of the template align with the edges of your pillow. Mark, then trim.
