


Cross-Steer Replacement Outer Boot Instructions


1. You can replace the bellow with the rack on or off of the car. First cut the zip tie off.




2. Next pull the O-ring off.



3. Then pull the boot off of the rack.




 Clean out any debris inside the rack, drain water out if any, and re-grease the teeth if needed. Turn rack all the way over to expose as many teeth as possible when doing this.



5. Center the rack back if it is not to make the install easier. Lubricate the inside lip of the new boot to help slide it onto the rack.



Pop the inside lip onto the rack housing where it belongs.



7. Push the boot all the way in so that the outer lip of the boot is covering the end cap of the rack. Then slip the new O-ring into the 2nd valley in on the boot so that it sits into the groove on the end cap. Push the O-ring down all the way around so that it is seated tightly into the groove.



8. Use the new zip-tie around the inside boot lip. Tighten it down and cut.



9. With a sharp blade carefully cut around the outer edge of the O-ring against the end cap to give a nice clean look.
