

## Beyond the Bird Feeder: Winter Gardening for Bird Lovers

Once the garden is cleaned up, the perennials tucked in for the winter, and the last load of mulch has been spread out, many gardeners will want to welcome their feathered friends to give color, movement, and birdsong to their winter landscape. In addition to providing feeders near your favorite window and a heated water source, winter is a good time to plan for next year's garden. Aim for an array of plants that will be an inviting, supportive environment year-round. Include plants that provide nesting materials, nourishing seeds and fruit, attract delicious insects, and can give protective shelter during the cold months. Emphasis should be placed on native plants for their ability to attract birds. In our list, an [N] indicates one or more available native species. Cultivars of natives and non-native plants, however, might also produce bountiful food and shelter and may prove desirable in terms of design and beauty. We have chosen these Bowood Farms selections because of their continuing usefulness during the winter months. Enjoy sharing your garden with the birds!
