Minute Mark 18:30

Today's necklace is a design that many viewers had admired Emily wearing on a previous episode made of pearls. So, in learning this design, Kate asked Emily how she would start choosing beads and she said she would start with an 11/0 seed bead.

Minute Mark 18:30

For Patterning with Stones, we created a "generic" recipe. You can <u>find it</u> on our website, next to the project samples.

- 1 Spool <u>.014 Soft Flex</u>
- 1 Tube <u>11/0 Seed Beads</u>
- 3 Strands of Semi-Precious Rounds in <u>4mm</u>, <u>6mm</u>, and/or <u>8mm</u>.
- 1-2 Strands Semi Precious Shapes (<u>Coins</u>, <u>5-8mm Rondelles</u>)
- 1 Strand <u>Freshwater Pearls</u> (optional)
- 1 Pkg <u>10mm Stone Rounds</u>
- <u>Crimp Tubes</u>
- <u>Crimp Covers</u>

You will also want to have: <u>Xuron 4-in-1 Crimper</u>, <u>Xuron Maxi-Shear Flush Cutters</u>, <u>Deep</u> <u>Dish Project Tray</u> and <u>Insert</u>, and <u>Clampers</u>.




Don't limit yourself if you have multiple options to choose from. Start laying the beads out and play with the colors, shapes, and sizes. Emily and Kate intentionally left these samples void of metal spacers and caps, but they do talk about how you can embellish your design by adding those extra details of sparkle and finish. In this design, the hero is the seed bead, which acts as a definer of negative and positive space; it quietly allows your other bead shapes to stand out, because it is simple and unadorned.



As you play, you begin to refine your Point of View. Your bead selection may not be one you're used to...as Kate and Emily remind us, beads don't spoil...so if you don't like what you end up with, you can take it apart with really no negative results. If you were sewing or cooking, your ingredients couldn't just be put back in the package, so that's one of the beauties of beading!

Also, we now have a <u>video you can watch</u> to find your idea necklace length. Janice measured Amy on 10/14/17 at a bead get together hosted by Janice and Drea in Alexandria, Va. Using an endless strand of pearls that Emily had strung, Janice finds the "ideal" lengths for Amy to make necklaces, earrings, and bracelets.





Whether you use a design board and triangles or you mix all your beads in a bowl and choose randomly, find the way to string that makes you happy.

It seemed like I (Janice!) was mentioned a lot in this week's broadcast. Maybe because I have spent so much time over the years thinking and breathing colors and patterns. I love seeing the creative light bulb go on for new stringers. Something bright and glowing shines brightly when a beader finds the magical key that unlocks the door to their creativity. It's why I keep doing this!

At **Minute Marker 57:55**, Kate introduces a bugle bead, <u>BGL2-2031</u> to the pattern to add an extra bit of texture and interest.

Go ahead and experiment with other beads you might add to the recipe.



At Minute Marker 1:00:33:

Closing begins! Watch as Kate talks about Soft Flex and adding crimp beads on either side of an ending bead. Be sure to leave a tiny bit of air so the Soft Flex will drape and bend when you double it over.



While Kate has been talking about crimping, look what Emily made! It's our Painted Desert sample, <u>found here</u>.



Kate checks for measurement...is it a good length? What do you think?



There is always so much to talk and laugh about. We hope you've enjoyed this week's broadcast. At the end of the day, it's about stringing. Be patient with yourself. Remember, beads don't "go bad," so you can string and restring as many times as you like! Happy Beading from all of us... ~Janice

And for anyone curious to see a "recipe" I have created from screen shots from our website, here is a page for ingredients that would do an endless design using glass and stone. I take screen shots that I download to my desktop. I then put them in a Pages document and move them around to find a grouping that pleases me. I work on an Apple, but if you use a PC, you can download the images to Word. I also usually give it a name and write something about it!

Recipe for Silvery Seashore:

Walking the coastline of ocean or the sandy beach of a lake is both calming and meditative. The water, the air, the sky all remind me of relaxed, easy days of childhood. In this soft, grey palette of silvers and blues, I am reminded of last summer at the shore. Adding the freshwater pearls gives it more sparkle. I would string it long on Soft Flex and ad a clasp. I 'd like it to wrap short, like a choker, so I would make it 60-64 Cut 68 inches of Soft Flex, Use bright silver crimps and covers.
