Leanne Loftus




Coming in First Place, "Paris" by Leanne Loftus received the most votes as fan favorite. Paris has the warmth of the original Born Yesterday sample but uses the smaller, more curvaceous Villagers Pendant, which lends feminine charm. Leanne has been a customer with us for quite some time and we are so excited to welcome her artistry to our website. Thank you, Leanne!

3 strands 8mm Flower Jade 1 10mm Dappled Serpentine bead Villagers Serpentine Pendant Regular C Lon - Moss Regular C Lon - Khaki 8/0 Picasso Chartreuse Seed Beads Beader's own button, we recommend: Pagoda- Serpentine



Cindy Brook Pi3 (Pi Cubed)

Coming in a very close second, "Pi3" is a bright and bold statement in both color and shape. Using both Venus Jasper and Black Silver Leaf Dice was a smart choice to add additional pattern to the design. Their distinctive cube silhouette against Black C-Lon macramé knots is visually strong. In addition, Cindy shows her creativity (and humor) by adding the pyrite rondelles in the macramé extension above the carnelian "Pi" disc. Thank you, Cindy!

3 strands of 8mm Second Wind Madame Butterful Carnelian Cross-stitch button antique silver Regular C Lon - Khaki Beader's own silver accent bead

We love how she used carved pendants in two sizes and colors and how she added more interest by using C-lon in both Celadon and Venetian Red. From Childhood- 8mm Shades of Blue- 8mm Flower Jade- 8mm Eternal Knot- Red Serpentine Infinity Clover- Green Serpentine Celadon - Regular C-Lon Venetian Red - Regular C-Lon Square Peg- Flower Serpentine Slice of Life 6 - Brass


