
# **Branched Wire Earrings**



Skill Level: Intermediate

Prerequisites: At least 1-2 beginner wire working classes.

The ever popular branched wire class is back...but with a new twist! Learn this sweet technique for adorning earrings and components and start branching out beyond the simple wire wrap.

Tying up Loose Ends



1.5 feet of 22 gaugewire(or 1 pair of 35mm beading hoops)



1 pair of earwires or posts



4 feet of 28 gauge wire



Assortment of 2-4mm beads

### Part 1: Getting Started



Step 1
Fold your piece of wire (18") in half round your hoop.



Step 2
Coil one end of wire around the hoop about 3 times for security of a starting point.



**Step 3**Start twisting your wire about 1/4".



**Step 4**Split one end of the wire up and thread on a bead. Leave about 1/4" gap from the center wire.



**Step 5**Fold the wire back and pinch both of the wire at the base of the bead.



**Step 6**Start twisting the wire until the wires meet again.



Step 7
Repeat step 4 through 6.



**Step 8**Continue on branch off.

**Step 9**Start branching out to the edge of the hoop to anchor and secure your design.



Step 10
Thread on a bead and wrap one wire to the component to anchor the branch.



Step 11
Continue to wrap the wires together. Try to keep the twisted look.



**Step 12**Now you have both your wires together again to twist.



**Step 13**Continue to twist toward the side of the component you want end your design.



Step 14
Thread on the last bead.



**Step 15**Bring the wires around on each side of the bead.



**Step 16**Coil the wires 2-3 times around the component. Cut the excess wire and tuck in to secure.
