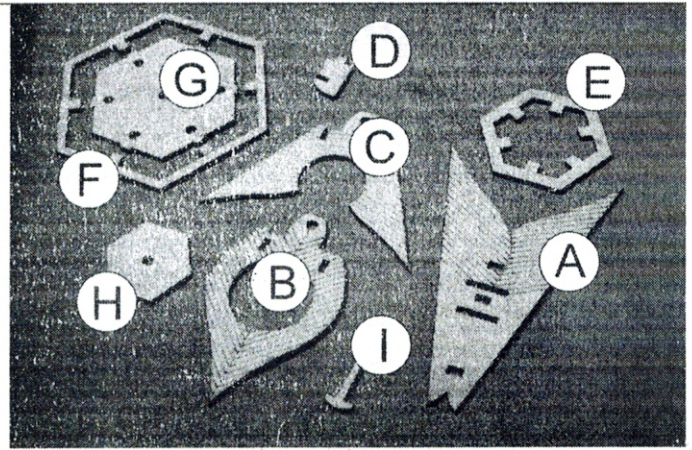


Flower Power Tower

Parts List:

- A - x6 Side panels
- B - x6 Top Petal
- C - x6 Bottom Petal
- D - x12 Petal Spacer
- E - x1 Lower Support Ring
- F - x1 Upper Support Ring
- G - x1 Top Plate
- H - x1 Bottom Plate
- I - x6 Holding Pins
- J - x2 Eye bolts (not pictured).
- K - x6 - 2" Flower Pots (not pictured).



The Basics..

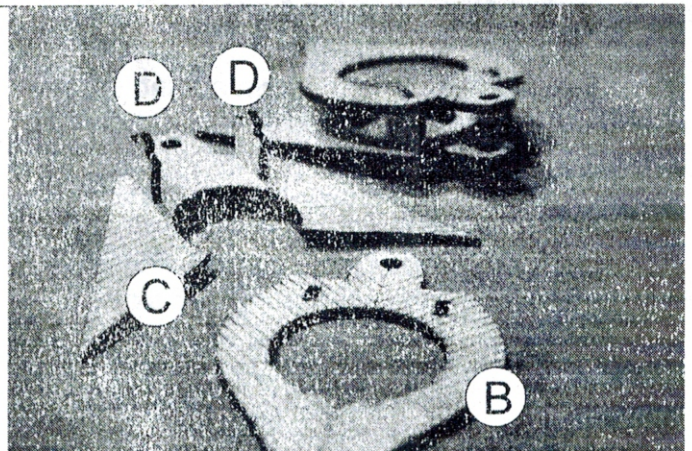
The Flower Power Tower is made up of tiers.. each assembled from 48+ parts in a complete kit. It was designed for ages above 12 years old to assemble. You should follow the order of the instructions carefully if so, as some parts might not be able to be assembled out of order).

Feel free to add any finish you want to the bare wood. A sealer for outdoors would

be required. Paint or stain should work well. You might consider doing all the finish work before beginning to assemble the parts. A light sanding will help make a smoother finish too.

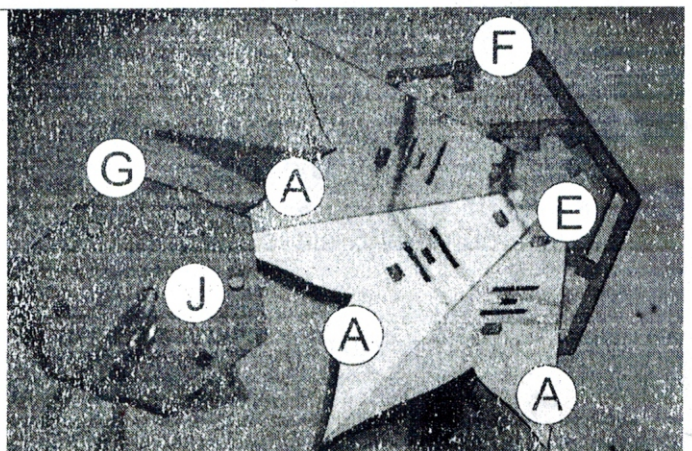
Flower Petals

Start with the bottom petal, Part (C). Slide in 2 spacers from the back, Part (D). Snap the top petal, Part (B), onto the spacers. Repeat these steps to make all 6 complete petals. Set these aside for later.



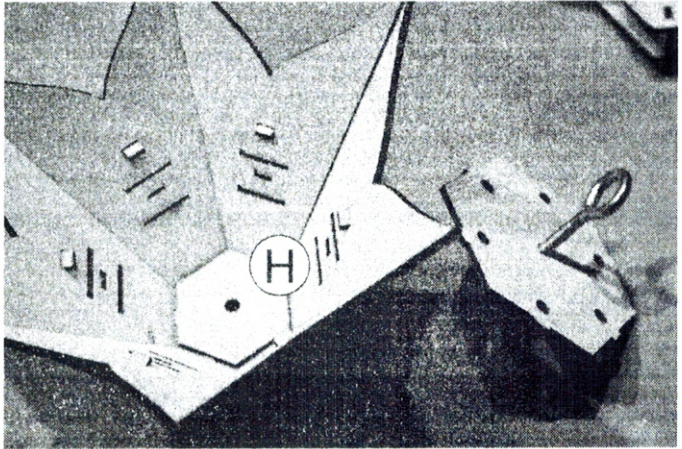
Building the Tower:

Line up the Upper and Lower Supports rings, Parts (F & E), onto one side panel, Part (A). The pieces will loosely lock. Continue around the rings placing in each side panel. You will begin to see the tower take shape with the correct "V" shaped angle. This would also be a good time to slip in the eye bolts, Part (J), into each of the plates, Parts (G & H).



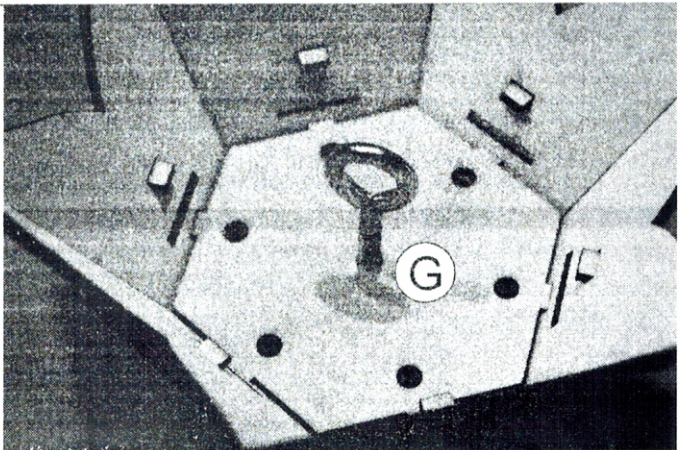
Add the plates:

With all sides of the tower fitted together, now you want to place the lower plate, Part (H), into the bottom. It will rest loosely in the bottom, but gravity will keep it held tight. You want to make sure the eye bolt (not pictured) is facing down. If this is the bottom tier on the plant chain, you might choose not to add the eye bolt.



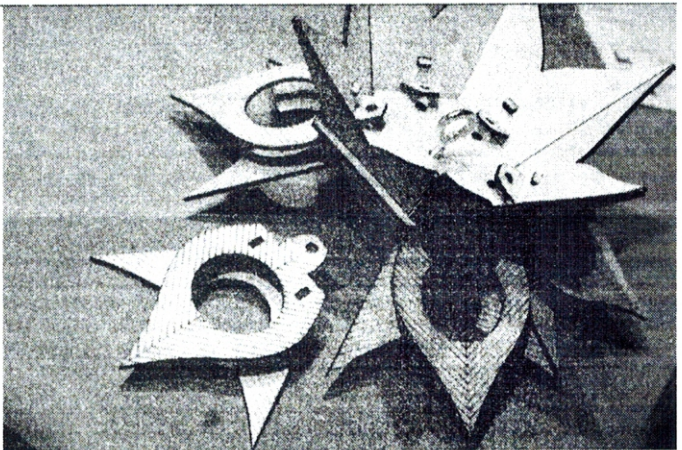
Next plate:

Next, you snap in the upper plate, Part (G). The eye bolt will need to be facing upward. Each of the sides will have a notch that snaps into their respective side panels. You may need to start with one side and go around the ring. The snug fit is what holds the entire tier together.



Add the petals:

Now is the time to begin adding each of the 6 petals you assembled before. The upper and lower petals will fit in snug into their slots. You may need to wiggle them in just right.. possibly adding some force. This is to ensure the pots stay in place as weight is added with dirt and water. Continue around all 6 sides.



Final step:

Lastly, the final pins need to be dropped in from the top to keep everything locked in place. When the petals and plates are all in the right spot, the pins will slide in fairly easily. Continue around all 6 sides to complete the circle.

Now your tier is ready to hang!
