About the Jesse True Series

Jesse True was created to help children learn that all feelings are okay. We often associate colors with feelings, such as "feeling blue" or "red with anger". When Jesse feels something strongly he generates energy, radiating a color that reflects his emotions. He glows different colors based on different feelings. Jesse's "super power" is changing colors.

Learning how to deal with feelings is critical for proper social and emotional development. Reason and consequence evolve as children grow, and they need encouragement, support, and guidance to help navigate and develop their emotions. The message Jesse gives children is that emotions, whether good or bad, are both natural and healthy.

Suppressing feelings can lead to long-term mental or health problems, such as behavioral issues, anxiety, depression, physical illnesses, and more. Children need to feel comfortable and confident in what they feel, in how to share their feelings, and properly deal with them. With emotional maturity, children have confidence in themselves, in their identity, and grow to become healthy and secure adults.


A color chart is provided at the end of each book. As you read about Jesse's experiences, encourage your children to identify and discuss Jesse's feelings, and see if they would feel the same in the same circumstances. Use Jesse's stories to open a dialogue with your children, so they are empowered to identify, share what they think or feel in a safe way, and learn to enjoy the spectrum of their emotions.

"Something isn't right. We need to go to the doctor!"




By the time they got to the doctor's office, Jesse's color was normal.

Jesse patiently looked at a magazine on space travel while waiting for his doctor.






Jesse's mother told Dr. Anastin what she saw.

"I don't think so," Dr. Anastin said. "I've never seen anything like this before. There is nothing wrong with him. He is perfectly healthy."


Jesse looked at his mother and his doctor. He did not know he was turning colors.


