DIFFICULTY •···

MATERIALS

Tulle Embroidery thread Embroidery hoop Craft glue

EQUIPMENT

Water soluble pen Embroidery needle Embroidery scissors

HELPFUL HINTS

- When choosing your tulle colour one closest to the colour of the wall you will display it on will yield the best results. Choosing a contrasting embroidery floss to this will also allow the design to pop.
- Knot your embroidery flow as close to the end as possible to prevent seeing the tail.
- A running stitch will make sure there is a clean line seen on the piece.
- A small dab of fabric glue can be put on the embroidery knots to hold them in place when cut short.

STEPS

1. Cut two squares of tulle 10cm larger than your hoop.

2. Lay the two layers of tulle on top of each other so the top layer sits perpendicular to the bottom layer.

3. Put the two layers into your embroidery hoop and sandwich tightly.

4. Draw out your design on your tulle.

5. Using a running stitch embroider over the pattern you've drawn out on your tulle.

6. Retrace the running stitch in the opposite side of the stitches so the clean line has thread on both the front and back of the piece.

7. Knot all the ends tightly then trim them close to the tulle so they are not as visible.

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8. Run a strip of glue around the back edge of the embroidery hoop to seal the tulle fabric. Allow to dry.

9. Cut the excess tulle as close to the embroidery hoop as possible.

10.Wipe the water soluble pen off the tulle with a damp cloth.

11. Display your finished hoop!
