Approximate Time of Project: 1 hour

MATERIALS

MAKR Natural Macrame Cord— Classic weave style ARBEE gold Ring 300mm ARBEE wood barrel beads in brown 17 x 18mm ARBEE wood barrel beads in brown 11 x 12mm ARBEE wood barrel beads in natural 11 x 12mm Dye

EQUIPMENT

Scissors Brush Bucket

Gloves

HELPFUL HINTS

 Half Knots are designed to twist so let the branches naturally do that.

ABBREVIATIONS

- RLK Reverse Larkshead knot
- HK Half knot
- SK Square knot
- DHH Diagonal Half Hitch
- B1 = Branch 1
- B2 = Branch 2 etc...

STEPS

- Cut eighteen 3m lengths and one 1m length of macrame cord.
- Attach two 3m lengths of cord in a RLK around the top middle of the ring (This will be Branch no.5)
- Work 6 HK on B5
- Attach two 3m lengths of cord in RLK around the ring to the left of your work (This will be Branch No.4)
- 5. Work 8 HK on B4
- Gather all of your working cords together and work 6
 HK around all of your working cords
- 7. Attach two 3m lengths of cord in RLK around the ring to the right of your work (This will be Branch No.6)
- 8. Work 16 HK on B6
- Gather ALL working cords together (including B4 & B5) and work 4 HK
- 10. Attach two 3m lengths of cord in RLK around the ring to the left of your work (This will be Branch No.3)
- 11. Work 14 HK on Branch No.3
- 12. Gather ALL cords together (B3, B4, B5 & B6) and work 4 HK
- 13. Attach four 3m lengths of cord in RLK around the ring to the left of your work (This will be Brach No.1 & Branch No.2)
- 14. Work 6 HK on the bottom 4 cords that will form B1
- 15. Work 8 HK on the top 4 cords that will form B2
- 16. Gather ALL cords from B1 & B2 together and work 6 HK
- 17. Attach four 3m RLK around the ring to the right of all of your work (This will form B7 & B8)
- 18. Work 6 HK in the top 4 cords that form B7









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- 19. Work 4 HK in the bottom 4 cords that will form B8
- 20. Gather ALL cords from B7 & B8 together and work 10 HK
- 21. Attach 2 lengths of cord around the hoop to the right of all your work (This will be Branch No.9
- 22. Work 12 HK on B9
- 23. Gather ALL cords from B7, B8 & B9 and work 4 HK
- 24. Now, Gather ALL cords from ALL branches and work 8 HK
- 25. All left over cords will now form the roots of the tree. Loop all cords around the bottom of the ring. Looping over, then under, then over again...36 ropes.
- 26. Using cords 13, 14, 15 & 16, work 1 SK
- 27. Using cords 17, 18, 19, & 20, work 1 SK
- 28. Using cords 21, 22, 23 & 24 work 1 SK
- 29. Using cords 15, 16, 17 & 18 work 1 SK
- 30. Using cords 19, 20, 21 & 22, work 1 SK
- 31. Using cords 17, 18, 19 & 20 work 1 x SK
- 32. This should form an upside down triangle shape
- 33. Using groups of 4 cords, starting from the left, work 1 SK on each gradually dropping the height of the SK to form a V shaped pattern
- 34. Take the middle 2 cords of each SK and thread 1 x ARBEE wood barrel bead in brown size 17x18mm on.
- 35. Take the very left cord as your knot bearing cord and work a DHH 8 times
- 36. Take the very right cord as your knot bearing cord and work a DHH 8 times

- 37. You should be left with two middle cords and the knot bearing cord from each side (left & right). Work 1 SK
- 38.Add 1 x ARBEE wood barrel bead in brown size 17x18mm to the middle two cords
- 39. Work 1 SK
- 40.To avoid a hole in the middle of the hanging cords, attach the 1m length macrame cord in a RLK to the back of the SK
- 41. Trim cords hanging from the bead to form a tassel.
- 42. Brush out cord to fluff up the tassel.
- 43. Attach alternate ARBEE wood barrel beads 11x12mm to each hanging cord.
- 44. Trim remaining cords to form a V shape.
- 45. Mix the dye into the bucket with water according to the instruction on the packet.
- 46. Soak the ends of the macramé in the dye solution and squeeze the cords in the dye to help the absorption.
- 47. Squeeze out excess dye and hang to dry outside.
- 48. Allow to dry completely before displaying.









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
