Knitting Needle Case

DIFFICULTY ●●●

Approximate Time of Project: 1 hour

MATERIALS:

Printed cotton
Plain cotton
Iron on interfacing
12mm bias tape
Thread

EQUIPMENT:

Fabric scissors
Ruler
Sewing machine

STEPS:

1. Cut the following (0.5cm seam allowance included);
 - a. Printed cotton
 - i. 51x51cm
 - ii. 51x21cm
 - b. Plain cotton
 - i. 51x51cm
 - ii. 51x21cm
 - c. Interfacing
 - i. 51x36cm
 - d. Bias tape
 - i. 51cm
 - ii. 75cm
 - iii. 230cm
2. Line interfacing up with the two corners of the printed cotton and fuse.
3. Pin and sew 75cm length of bias tape in half so the raw edges are enclosed. Stitch this length of bias tape 20cm from the bottom and 3cm in from the left side of the 51x51cm printed fabric. Set the piece aside.
4. Pin and baste the two 51x21cm pieces together right sides out. Pin and sew 51cm bias tape to one long side.
5. Line the 51x21cm rectangle up with two corners of the plain cotton. Pin and baste the three raw edges with the printed cotton side facing out.
6. Pin and sew lines vertically down the pocket ranging between 4 and 1cm in width to create smaller pockets along the 51cm length. Be sure to back stitch at both ends of each to avoid stitches pulling.
7. Pin the two 51x51cm piece together right sides out so the two interfacing corners touch the pocket corners and sew around the edge. Trim the edge to tidy.
8. Pin and sew remaining binding around the edge of the roll turning it under itself and overlapping at the end.
9. Slide needles into each pocket, fold flap (where interfacing ends) over the needles and roll. Tie the bias binding tie around the roll to keep it secure.
