Beaded Baby Sandals

EASY CROCHET

Gorgeous and fun sandals made from our printed Baby Soft 8ply yarn, featuring a simple rounded toe and classic ankle strap with button closure. Perfect for a cute and casual look for at the park or pair with pattern P040 - Baby Soft Baby Romper for a complete look. A small project that crochets up quickly it makes a great gift for soon-to-be mothers.

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY ●●●

CROCHET HOOK & EQUIPMENT:

A 4.00mm crochet hook.
A 3.50mm crochet hook.
Wool needle for sewing in ends.
Beads, hole must be big enough to thread a wool needle through.
2 x buttons, 10mm.

TENSION:

Tension is not important for this project, please refer to the sole length for the size you're making.

CROCHET ABBREVIATIONS:

ch: chain
sl st: slip stitch
dc: double crochet
dc2tog: double crochet 2 together
dc3tog: double crochet 3 together
htr: half treble crochet
tr: treble crochet

SANDAL

Sole (Make Four Alike):

Using C1 and a 3.50mm crochet hook, ch10 (12 - 14 - 20).

Round 1: Working into the front post only, 2htr into the 2nd ch from the hook, htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17), 6htr into the last chain, rotate the work and continue onto the opposite side of the chain, working into the back post of the chain now, htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17), 2htr into the last st. Close the round with a sl st ... 24 (28 - 32 - 44) sts

Round 2: Ch1, starting in the same st, 2htr into the next 2sts. htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17), 2htr into the next 6 sts. htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17). 2htr into the last 2sts. Close the round with a sl st ... 34 (38 - 42 - 54) sts

Round 3: Ch1. Start in the same st, *2htr, htr, repeat from * once more. htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17). *2htr, htr, repeat from * five more times. htr 7 (9 - 11 - 17). *2htr, htr, repeat from * once more. Close the round with a sl st. Cut yarn, fasten off securely. Weave in ends ... 44 (48 - 52 - 64) sts

Make 4 of the soles, in the white yarn.

Place wrong sides of two soles together. Using a chain stitch and M, secure the soles together, taking care to line the chs on each sole with each other. Repeat for the other foot.

Sides of Sole:

Using a sl st and 4.00mm hook, attach C1 to any st on the top layer.

Round 1: Ch1, Dc2tog, inserting the hook through the sts in both layers. Continue in this manner working in the round, sl st to close ... 44 (48 - 52 - 64) sts

Round 2: Ch1, dc into each st in the round, sl st to close ... 44 (48 - 52 - 64) sts
Repeat Round 2 once more, cut yarn and fasten off securely. Weave in ends.

Rounded Toe:

Using 4.00mm hook and M, dc12 into the toe edge of the sole, taking care

that the sts are evenly space either side of the foot.

Do not continue to work in the round as you have been, turn,

Row 2: Sl st into the next ch on the side sole (counts as your turning ch), dc 11, dc3tog (the final dc in the row, the side of the same dc and the next dc from the side sole), turn ... 13 dc

Row 3: Sl st into the next ch on the side sole (counts as your turning ch), dc 12, dc3tog (the final dc in the row, the side of the same dc and the next dc from the side sole), turn ... 14dc

Row 4: Sl st into the next ch on the side sole (counts as your turning ch), dc 13, dc3tog (the final dc in the row, the side of the same dc and the next dc from the side sole), turn ... 15dc

Continue in this manner adding in a single stitch for every row worked, until there are 17 (19 - 20 - 22) dc. Cut yarn and fasten securely.

Ankle Strap:

Using 4.00mm hook and M, thread 5 (5 - 6 - 6) beads onto the yarn using a wool needle. Dc17 (19 - 19 - 21) into the heel edge of the sole, taking care that the sts are evenly space either side of the foot, turn.

Row 1: Ch1, dc2tog, dc13 (15 - 16 - 18), dc2tog, turn... 15 (17 - 18 - 20)dc

Row 2: Ch1, dc2tog, dc11 (13 - 14 - 16), dc2tog, turn... 13 (15 - 16 - 18)dc

Row 3: Ch1, dc2tog, dc9 (11 - 12 - 14), dc2tog, turn... 11 (13 - 14 - 16)dc

Continue in this manner decreasing by 2 on ea row until there are 9dc left and do not turn.

Next Row: Ch6 (6 - 8 - 8) (creates a button tab), turn, dc into the 2nd ch from the hook and each dc in the row, again do not turn, instead ch20 (22 - 24 - 28), turn

Next Row: dc into the 2nd ch from the hook, dc to end of the row, turn ... 34 (36 - 40 - 44) dc

Next Row: Ch1, dc 17 (19 - 19 - 21), move the first bead as close to the hook as possible and dc to lock it in place, make sure the bead is positioned to face the front of the strap. *dc2, move another bead into position and dc into place, repeat from * 3 (3 - 4 - 4) more times and dc to end. ch6, turn.

Next Row: Dc into the first st of the previous row (button loop made), dc into every st until the end of the row. Fasten off securely and weave in all ends.

Repeat for the other strap, reversing the placement of the ankle strap and the button tab.
