Painted Easter Eggs

Approximate Time of Project: 10 min
(drying time not included)

MATERIALS

Plastic refillable Easter eggs
Paint (white, black and green)
Craft foam sheets (white and pink)
Wide wooden craft stick
Hot glue sticks

EQUIPMENT

Paint brush
Paint palette
Pen
Craft sheet
Scissors
Hot glue gun

HELPFUL HINTS

Pop the eggs open to paint the outside. This will let you paint while holding the inside of the egg.

The wooden craft stick will provide a platform for the egg to stand upright.

STEPS

1. Paint on a base coat of your chosen paint colour. Set aside to dry. Paint on a second coat if needed.
2. Rabbit eggs:
 - a. Cut two large ear shapes and two large ovals from the white foam sheet. Cut two smaller ears from the pink foam sheet.
 - b. Cut the wooden craft stick into 2cm lengths.
 - c. Glue pink ears to the centre bottom of the larger white ears.
 - d. Glue ears to either side of the pointy top of the egg.
 - e. Glue the two ovals overlapping to the base of the egg. Glue the wooden craft stick length beneath the ovals.
 - f. Using a fine brush paint a face on the front of the egg using black paint.
3. Cactus eggs:
 - a. Create different pink flowers from the pink craft foam.
 - b. Glue the flowers to the top of the eggs. Allow to dry.
 - c. Using black paint and a fine brush paint different spikes around the eggs.
 - d. Cut the wooden craft stick into 2cm lengths and glue to the bottom of the egg. If placing these eggs in a planter a wooden craft stick length isn't necessary.
4. Allow eggs to dry completely before filling.
