

# Cosy Basketweave Rug EASY CROCHET

The Basketweave stitch is one of our favourite ways to add texture and structure to projects. Crocheted holding two ends together, the result is a rug that's durable enough for daily traffic but still plush underfoot. Worked up in our Makr Cosy Yarn, the result is a cost effective way to get a luxurious, wool rug into your home. The rug shown here is our Mat size.

## **MEASUREMENTS**

| Length (approx)                  | cm         | 60  | 150          | 165       |
| Yarn Required:<br>Makr Cosy Wool | 100g balls | 12  | 40           | 62        |

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

# **DIFFICULTY** • • •

# **CROCHET HOOK & EQUIPMENT:**

A 5.00mm crochet hook. Wool needle for sewing in ends. Yarn for fringing if desired.

## **TENSION:**

16 tr and 9 rows to 10cm over basketweave pattern, using 5.00mm crochet

## **CROCHET ABBREVIATIONS:**

chain ch: treble crochet tr: sl st: slip stitch

front post treble crochet fptr: bptr: back post treble crochet half treble crochet htr:

## RUG

# **Base Triangle:**

Using 5.00mm and working two ends of Cosy Wool as one, ch 103 (135 -191).

**Row 1:** Tr into the 3rd ch from hook and in every ch along, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, \*fptr around next 4 sts, bptr around next 4 sts, repeat from \* until 1st remains. Htr in turning ch from previous row. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 2, \*bptr around next 4 sts, fptr around next 4 sts, repeat from \* until 1st remains. Htr into turning ch from previous row. Turn.

Row 4: Ch 2, \*bptr around next 4 sts, fptr around next 4 sts, repeat from \* until 1st remains. Htr into turning ch from previous row. Turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, \*fptr around next 4 sts, bptr around next 4 sts, repeat from \* until 1st remains. Htr into turning ch from previous row. Turn.

Repeat rows 2-5 until piece measures 100 (150-165) cm from the beginning, fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends.

## FRINGING (OPTIONAL)

To add fringing to the rug, begin by cutting equal lengths of yarn. Fold three strands of yarn for one fringe, forming a loop at one end.

Take your hook and ins the hook from the back of the work, draw the loop through the edge stitch of one end of the scarf. Secure the fringing by pulling the ends of the yarn through the loop.

Repeat this process on every third stitch until the end of the row.

Repeat for the other end. You may comb out the yarn to create a fluffier fringe.
