

Kimana Herringbone Stitch Throw INTERMEDIATE KNIT

Made from a luscious, wool-blend and finished with soft fringing, this throw adds texture and luxury to any living room or bedroom. Knitted up in a beautiful delicate stitch, this throw is great for knitters who are looking to master a new stitch. Shown here is our Lapghan sized throw.

MEASUREMENTS

Length		120	150	180
Yarn Required: European Collection Kimana	100g balls	8	13	19

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY •••

KNITTING NEEDLES & EQUIPMENT:

A 5.00mm circular needle, 80cm or longer. Wool needle for sewing in ends.

TENSION:

22 sts and 16 rows to 10cm over herringbone pattern, using 5.00mm needles.

KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:

K: Knit

K2tog: Knit 2 Together

Kfb: K1 into the fr of the next stitch on the needle but do not slide

the stitch off, K1 into the bk of the same stitch on the needle

and slide the stitch off the needle

Purl

P2tog: Purl 2 Together Sli: Slip One Stitch knitwise

BLANKET

NOTE: This pattern is written for our Lapghan size blanket, all stitch counts and references for other sizes are written in brackets for easy reference. They are as follows, Lapghan (**Small Throw** - Large Throw)

Stitch Pattern:

NOTE: This pattern uses circular needles to manage the large number of stitches, work back and forth in rows only. Do not join to work in the round.

Using 5.00mm needles, cast on 99 (144 - 164) sts.

Knit 1 rows, this will make it easier to attached the fringing at each end.

Row 2: K1, P1, *Pfb, repeat from * to last stitch K1 ... 195 (285 - 325) sts

Row 3 (RS): K2, *Sl1 knitwise, K1, inserting the LN into the slipped st lift it over the knitted stitch and back onto your LN, ins the right needle into the slipped stitch from right to left, knit it and pull off the needle. Repeat from * until last st, K1.

Row 4 (WS): K1, P1, *P2tog leaving stitches on needle, Purl the first st again and drop both sts from the LN, repeat from * to last st, K1.

Rows 3 and 4 form a herringbone stitch, repeat these two rows until piece measures 120 (150 - 180) cm from the beginning ending with a WS row.

Next Row (RS): K1, P1, *K2tog, repeat from * to last stitch, K1 ... 99 (**144** - 164) sts

Knit 2 rows.

Cast off and weave in all ends.

FRINGING

To add fringing to the blanket, begin by cutting equal lengths of C1. Fold three strands of yarn for one fringe, forming a loop at one end. Take your hook and ins the hook from the back of the work, draw the loop through the edge stitch of one end of the scarf. Secure the fringing by pulling the ends of the yarn through the loop. Repeat this process on every fifth stitch until the end of the row. Repeat for the other end. You may comb out the yarn to create a fluffier fringe.

FINISHING

Weave in any remaining ends. To care for this blanket, spot clean only but if it must be washed, lightly hand wash only and avoid any agitating.
