Dog Bandana

BEGINNER KNIT

A stylish accessory for your four-legged friend, our dog bandanas are an easy project for the beginning knitter. Simple shaping and basic stitch patterns, help build your confidence in increasing and decreasing correctly. Made from our cotton 4ply, these can be soaked in water to keep your pooch cool in summer or sprayed with a calming spray for anxious pooches.

MEASUREMENTS

Yarn Required:			
Cotton 4ply (M)	100g balls	1	1
Cotton 4ply (C1)	100g balls	0	1

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

ITEM A: Tie Back Bandana



DIFFICULTY ●●●

KNITTING NEEDLES & EQUIPMENT:

A 3.25mm pair of needles.
Wool needle for sewing in ends.

TENSION:

28 sts and 32 rows to 10cm over stocking st, using 3.25mm needles.

KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:

K: Knit
K2tog: Knit 2 Together
Kfb: K1 into the fr of the next stitch on the needle but do not slide the stitch off, K1 into the bk of the same stitch on the needle and slide the stitch off the needle
P: Purl
P2tog: Purl 2 Together
Pfb: Purl 1, Purl tbl to increase by 1

TIE BACK BANDANA

Casting On:

Cast on 3 sts
Row 1: Knit to end.
Row 2: Purl to end.
 These two rows form a stocking st pattern.

Increase Patterns:

Row 3: K2, Kfb, Knit to last three sts, Kfb, K2.
Row 4: Purl to end.
 The above two rows form the increase patterns for the bandana.

Increase using the pattern for your size until there are 19 sts ending with a wrong side row.

Change to C1, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 29 sts.

Change to M, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 59 sts.

Change to C1, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 69 sts.

Change to M, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 99 sts.

Change to C1, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 109 sts.

Change to M, continue to increase with stitch pattern until there are 139 sts.

Continue to work in the pattern above changing between M and C1 and **AT THE SAME TIME** continuing to work the increases until there are 179 sts, work even for 4 rows and cast off.

OVER COLLAR BANDANA

Cast on 70 sts, using M.

Begin to work in stocking st without shaping until piece measures 10cm from the beginning ending with a WS row, place a marker at the beginning and end of the row to mark where hem will be sewn in.

Work a further 6 rows stocking st.

Next Row: K2, SSK, Knit to last four sts, K2tog, K2.

Next Row: Purl all sts

Repeat the above two rows until 2 sts remain, K2tog and fasten off.

Using a length of yarn and a wool needle, with WS facing fold back cast on hem so that it meets the markers. Sew in place.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends, steam and block gently into shape.
